Dear Teacher,

These work sheets have been designed for use in the classroom, during your visit to the museum and afterwards. You will have seen many more paintings with your class while visiting the Uffizi, but these images have been selected for their wonderful variety. Please remember a few useful tips:

1. During the visit, allow your pupils to write down the name of the artist and the title of the work on each Work sheet.

2. Use -ing forms to describe actions in paintings:

Q:What is the angel doing?

A: He's smiling and offering flowers to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Q: Is he standing?

A: No, he's kneeling.

Q: What else is he doing?

A: He's looking up at Mary.

3. Also use the verb "to wear" in the -ing form:

Q: What is the angel wearing?

A: He's wearing a long, white robe and a crown on his head.

4. You will find some flash cards in this packet: red for nouns, pink for adjectives, green for verbs, yellow for adverbs and blue for pronouns. Use the words to practice describing an angel, as the one in the following reproduction. After your museum visit, use them again for each of the activities in the work sheets.

FOR THE TEACHER:

Here is a reproduction of the Annunciation painted by Fra Angelico on the second floor of the convent of San Marco. It is a fresco and it was seen by the friars and the novices who would retire to their cells on that floor. It is dated around 1440. There are several elements to look at with the class, as a preliminary activity for "Angels". Here are a few: the angel has just landed, as we can see by the movement of the wings. He is bowing to Mary with hands crossed against his chest. The wings are in bright, lively colours and recall the pattern of the peacock's feathers (the peacock was not only the sacred bird of Juno, but a symbol for rebirth through Christ for Christianity). The angel is the Archangel Gabriel and he is greeting Mary before making the announcement of her conception of the Son of God. The drapery of his robe is rich in folds and of precious light red-dyed wool with gold trimmings. The angel's hair matches the colour of his golden halo. Note the setting of the scene: the meeting takes place under the arches of a small cloister that resembles the original designed by Michelozzo on the ground floor of the convent (archways and groin vaults resting on capitals of the composite and Ionic type, typical of the classical revival popular in the Renaissance). In the background you can see a verdant wood, behind a tall fence in front of which is a meadow full of flowers: it stands for the Hortus conclusus, or sealed garden, a symbol used to indicate Mary's virginity.






Talking about a Painting




A person who makes a painting is an artist. This is a palette for all the colours
