Chris Blandford President World Heritage UK (WHUK)

Chris Blandford was Founder and Chairman of the multi-disciplinary CBA studios between 1977 and 2017. The practice undertook landscape architecture, master planning, environmental and heritage consultancy for both public and private clients . His influential landscape planning and cultural heritage work in the UK spans many different scales and most of the development and conservation sectors. He has also worked extensively in the Middle East, Far East and Europe.

Chris is a Fellow of the Landscape Institute and served as an assessor for the Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE) and the Millennium Commission. As a volunteer he is currently the President of World Heritage UK (WH:UK) and Vice President of the national Gardens Trust.



Andrea Bruciati

Director of the Villa Adriana and Villa d'Este

Art historian, he has numerous curatorial projects to his credit and collaborates with trade magazines. He directed the Municipal Gallery of Contemporary Art of Monfalcone from 2002 to 2012 and, thanks to this experience and that of ArtVerona's Artistic Director from 2014 to 2016, he is identified as the major promoter of emerging contemporary research, rooted in the historical context Italian. In fact, since 2017 he has been directing the Villa Adriana and Villa d'Este Institute in Tivoli, which he called VILLÆ. As Director, in addition to having created the formats *The Circular Institute, Grand Tour: Legacy of the 21st Century XXI, Atlas: the inventory of a museum open to the world* and a Festival for the promotion of film culture, he has created an intense program of exhibitions, including: *And tell me that you don't want to die* (2018); *Eva vs Eva. The twofold importance of the feminine in western imagery* (2019); *60/20: Villa Adriana between cinema and UNESCO* (2020); *Ecce Homo. The encounter between the divine and the human for a different anthropology* (2021), *Human all too Human: athletic contests from glory to the dust* (2022); *Theatra Mundi: Pino Pascali* (2023). Future exhibition projects are: Antiquaria Naturalia et Mirabil-ia: the cardinals Villas of Tivoli, Bagnarola; Villa Adriana altera Roma: the Rediscovery and its legacy in the Renaissance.



Alberta Campitelli

President of Scientific Committee for Museums - Ministry of Culture of Italy and vice President APGI

Art and garden historian, until 2016 Director of the Villas and Historical Parks of the Municipality of Rome, she oversaw important restoration works on gardens and buildings in several Roman villas, where she realized a few museums, managing their direction. She continually participates in National and International conferences on the topics of knowledge and management of historic gardens. In 2022 she was appointed by the Ministry of Culture as President of the Commission for the allocation of European funds for the restoration of historic parks and gardens. She is a professor of Museum and Cultural Heritage Management at the Luiss University, and of History and Management of Gardens at the School of Specialization in Natural and Environmental Heritage of the La Sapienza University. She is advisor member of the ICOMOS-International Scientific Committee for Cultural Landscape, Vice-President of the Italian Parks and Gardens Association, President of the Scientific Committee for Museums and member of the Hight Council for Cultural and Landscape Heritage at the Ministry of Culture. She is member of the Scientific Council of the Ninfa Garden, co-Director of the editorial series "Gardens and Landscape" of the Olschki publisher, on the board of the magazine "Studies in the History of Gardens & Designed Landscapes". In 2013 she received the honor of Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres by the Republic of France for the engagement in cultural collaboration between Italy and France. Among the latest volumes published, are to be mentioned "Villas and Gardens of Italy" (2019) and the updated reprint of "Gli Horti dei Papi. The Vatican Gardens from the Middle Ages to the Twentieth Century" (2021), whose first edition was in 2009. In 2022 she curated, with Tiziana Maffei and Alessandro Cremona, the exhibition "Fragments of Paradise. Gardens over time at the Royal Palace of Caserta", and the relevant catalogue.



Andreina Contessa

Director of the Historical Museum and Park of the Castle of Miramare and the Friuli Venezia Giulia Regional Department of Museums

Director since 2017 of the Historical Museums and the Park of Miramare Castle in Trieste and since 2020 of the DRM (National Museums in the Friuli Venezia Giulia region). An art historian and graduate of the University of Parma, she lived for many years in Jerusalem, where she earned a Ph.D., taught at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and directed the Nahon Museum of Italian Jewish Art.

An art historian, scholar of medieval and modern art, manuscripts, Jewish art, and exhibition curator, she is engaged in multimedia, artistic and historical heritage promotion, green museums and sustainability projects, combining experience and interests in museums with a passion for research. She has written books and many essays that have been published in international scientific publications.



Bruce Edelstein

Coordinator for Graduate Programs and Advanced Research at NYU Florence

Bruce is Coordinator for Graduate Programs and Advanced Research at NYU Florence. He has held fellowships at Villa I Tatti and the Kunsthistorisches Institut in Florenz. In 2014, he was named Honorary Member of the Accademia delle Arti del Disegno di Firenze. His publications include: articles on Eleonora di Toledo's biography, iconography and artistic patronage; studies on sixteenth-century Medici gardens; and essays on works by Medici court painters and sculptors, such as Bronzino, Cellini, Pontormo, and Tribolo. He was the curator of the exhibition *Eleonora di Toledo and the Invention of the Medici Court in* Florence, for the Uffizi Galleries in 2023, and co-curator of the exhibition *Miraculous Encounters: Pontormo from Drawing to Painting*, seen at the Palazzo Pitti in Florence, the Morgan Library and Museum in New York, and the J. Paul Getty Museum in Los Angeles in 2018-2019. His book, *Eleonora di Toledo and the Creation of the Boboli Gardens*, was published in July 2022 by Sillabe for the Uffizi Galleries.

Graduated Landscape Architect, Head of the Institute of Landscape Architecture, Urban Planning and Garden Art Budapest, Hungarian University of Agriculture and Life Sciences, IFLA Eu delegate of HALA, founder and curator of Hungarian Garden Heritage Foundation. Professor Fekete is Doctor in Landscape Architecture (PhD) and in Architecture (DLA), researcher, teacher, quest lecturer in several european and overseas universities, among others in the East China Normal University in Shanghai (CHI), Tongji Uniersity in Shanghai (CHI), Zhengzhou Agricultural University (CHI), IESCOA Mumbai (IN), Buenos Aires University (AR), Massachussets University Amherst (USA), Craców University of Technology (PL), Czech University of Life Sciences Prague (CZ), Zagreb Agricultural University (CR), Babes Bolyai University Cluj Napoca (RO). Dr. Fekete is licenced landscape architect and licensed for renovation of heritage gardens sites, with international design experiences. Founder and owner since 2000 of the Lépték Terv Landscape Office in Budapest and since 2007 of the AB PLAN Design Office in Romania. He is leader or co-author of more than 70 realized landscape projects related mainly to heritage site preservation in Hungary, Romania, Germany, Holland and Spain, Awarded among others in 15 design competitions and winner of several national and international professional recognitions, for instance the "Landscape Architect of the Year" prize in Hungary in 2012 and 2017, and the Europa Nostra Award in Research cathegory, in 2014.

Beside teaching and planning, he has a vast experience of several international cooperations and research programmes (Landscape and Democracy, LED2Leap, EuLand21, INNOLAND etc) with universities and professional partners.

A graduate of the University of Udine, he specialised in the history of art criticism at the Scuola Normale Superiore in Pisa. Since 2012 he has been an official art historian for the Ministry of Culture. He first worked at the Soprintendenza per i Beni Storici, Artistici ed Etnoantropologici di Modena e Reggio Emilia, and since 2015 he has been on the staff of Direzione Regionale Musei della Toscana (National Museums in Tuscany Region) and he is director of the Garden of the Medici Villa di Castello, the Medici Villa di Petraia and the Medici Villa di Cerreto Guidi.



Łukasz Przybylak

M.Sc. landscape architect, specialist in historic gardens, Vice-President of the European Route of Historic Gardens

Author of numerous revaluations and studies for historical residences in Poland (carried out under the banner of Hortus Excelsior). He collaborated with the Swiss landscape architecture studio VOGT Landschaftsarchitekten AG Berlin branch, among others, on the design documentation for Lohsepark Hafencity in Hamburg and with Brandenburgische Schlösser GmbH on the implementation phase of the revaluation of the palace park in Altdöbern. Over the period 2016-2019, he completed accompanying internships in the field of garden heritage management at the Stiftung Preussische Schlösser und Gärten in Potsdam and at Historic Royal Palaces (Hampton Court, Kensington, Kew). From 2015 to 2021, he headed the Garden Department of the former royal garden in Wilanów - Warsaw where, in addition to coordinating the day-to-day care of the garden, he developed the restoration documentation and oversaw the implementation of its subsequent stages. In 2021, he started working with the Chancellery of the President of the Republic of Poland as an adviser on historical gardens where he is responsible for restoration activities in the surroundings of the residence of the President of the Republic of Poland. He is co-founder of the Eduard Petzold European Centre for Garden Art (ECSO). Since 2020, he has been pursuing doctoral research on garden art in Warsaw during the reign of the Wettin family at the Technical University of Dresden. Since 2017, he has been associated with the European Route of Historic Gardens (ERHG) - a cultural route of the Council of Europe and has been its vice-president since 2020. He is also a member of the German Society for Garden Art and Landscape Culture (DGGL) Berlin-Brandenburg branch and the DGGL working group on historic gardens. He is also affiliated with the Dresden Historical Society (DGV). Since 2023 he is a member of a Landscape Architecture Association (SAK).



Júlia Roman Quetgles

Professor at the Historic Sciences and Arts Theory Department, University of Illes Balears, linked to the Department of Historical Sciences and Theory of the Arts, teaches the Degree in Art History and the Master's in Cultural Heritage: Research and Management

Júlia teaches the Degree in Art History and the Master's in Cultural Heritage. Her research activity focuses mainly on art and the protection of historic gardens as well as the cultural landscape. The main results are collected in the thesis *The gardens of Mallorca in the 18th and 19th centuries. From the illustrated landscape to bourgeois eclecticism* (UIB, 2017).

Subsequently, she has carried out research around several state-level research projects. She is currently a researcher in the I+D+i project *El paisaje que habla. Theoretical framework and interdisciplinary cultural references. Mexico, Portugal and Spain as scenarios.* (PID2020-120553GB-I00), financed by MCIN/AEI/10.13039/501100011033, with which she works on the representation of the garden and the landscape in the history of art and the regulations for the protection of the landscape in Hispanic American.

At the same time, she has worked on the conservation and restoration of the green heritage as a drafting member of projects for the restoration of historic gardens. Among all, the link in the recovery and enhancement of the Raixa gardens stands out. She has also participated in national and international conferences to publicize the heritage of Mallorca's gardens, as well as in its dissemination by giving conferences and coordinating courses.

Among the publications, we highlight *El jardí botànic de la Misericòrdia de Palma* (Consell de Mallorca, 2005), *Els jardins d'Alfàbia: materialitat, concepte i interpretació* (Revista Materialidades, 2016), and, *Els jardins de Raixa. Guia historicoartística* (Consell de Mallorca, 2019).

Nikolaos Thymakis is Agronomist MSc (Natural Resources Management) and is engaged in the Horticulture and Landscaping since 1998. He worked in 3 different Municipalities in Attica Region between 2000 and 2020, in suburbs of Athens, as Landscape Supervisor and Consultant for Urban Green and EU Programs (LIFE, H2020, Erasmus). As Honorary President of Hellenic Plant Exporters and Importers Association (HEPEXIA) he represents Greece in European Nursery stock Association (ENA) and International Association of Plant Producers (AIPH). Worked also in Qatar, Turkey, KSA, Cyprus, Holland, S. Korea, and Taiwan. His most important work is the rejuvenation of Halki Theological School Gardens (Heybeliada-Constantinople). As a Landscape Consultant is convinced that the "landscaping" is a "tool" of cultural, tourism -and not only- to promote Greece. It enhances the dynamics of sustainable and self-sustaining "Hellenic Garden" worldwide with his activities as much as "Elaionia (Ελαία + Αιώνια) Landscapes" and the "Byzantine Garden". He served as Director of "Syggros Horticulture and Garden Academy" and Tutor in Garden Design and Landscape Management. He is member of board of "Metropolitan Green of Athens S.A" (Historical Parks of National Garden of Athens, and Philopappos Hill -Parthenon Landscape management, cultural heritage place under the design of Demetrios Pikionis, Athens). He currently works as Deputy Horti/Landscape Manager at Balkan Botanic Garden of Kroussia and started his PhD Thesis in Politecnico di Milano in Landscape Architecture and Cultural Heritage about Monastic Gardens in Byzantine Period.



Paola Viola Salvaguarda e Valorizzazione del Complesso del Parco, Reggia Di Caserta

Graduated in Conservation of Cultural and Environmental Heritage, since 2000 she has worked at Reggia di Caserta - Ministry of Culture - at the Conservation and Enhancement Service of Gardens. She deals with the technical-scientific activities relating to the care and enhancement of the environmental and landscape heritage of the Royal Palace of Caserta.
