### Who we are

# What are cookies and what do they do?

A cookie is a small text file which is placed onto your device (e.g., computer, smartphone or other electronic device) when you use our website. We use cookies on our website to record that you have been shown the information about the cookies we set, to distinguish between humans and bots using our contact form so we can reduce spam, to analyse how people interact with our website for statistics and marketing purposes. For example, we may monitor how many visitors we receive, how they access our website (e.g. from a search engine or directly inputting our address) and how long people spend on each page of the site. This information will be used in aggregate to help us to understand how people are using our website so that we can improve it and so that we can review and adapt our general marketing strategy.

#### Our use of cookies

When you browse this website, the following categories of cookies are set and used on your device:

# 1. Strictly necessary cookies

These cookies are essential for the operation of this website and are used in features such as logging in to access secure areas of our websites. Without these cookies, services you have requested cannot be provided. These cookies cannot be switched off in our systems. They are usually only set in response to actions made by you which amount to a request for services, such as setting your privacy preferences, logging in or filling in forms. You can set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but some parts of the site will not then work. These cookies do not store any personally identifiable information.

### 2. Functional cookies

These cookies allow websites and applications to remember choices you make (such as your language or the region you are in). They provide enhanced, more personal features. The information these cookies collect is usually anonymised which means we can't identify you personally. We use these types of cookies to improve your experience on our sites.



### 3. Analytics cookies

To keep our website relevant, easy to use and up to date, we use the Google Analytics cookie to recognise and count the number of visitors and see how many visitors and to see ow visitors moved around the website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily. All the information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. If you do not allow these cookies then we will not know you have visited our site and will not be able to monitor its performance.

These web analytics services may be designed and operated by other companies on our behalf. They do this using small invisible images known as "web beacons" or "tracking pixels", included within the Digital Product and are used to count the number of times something has been seen.

### 4. How to turn off all cookies and consequences of doing so

If you do not want to accept cookies from any websites, you may be able to change your browser settings so that cookies (including those which are essential to the services requested) are not accepted. If you do this, please be aware that you may lose some of the functionality of our (and other) websites.
