Conditions of Entry

ELIGIBILITY and ACCEPTANCE

- Maximum number of horses accepted in competitions will be dependent on time constraints
- EA Novice to Advanced:. Performances are not required. However, entries with a performance at respective levels during the qualifying period will receive preference over those without a qualifier if oversubscribed
- Young Horse competitions: No performances required.
- FEI competitions must have met the qualification criteria in line with EA rule 10.17.3
- **CDN** Entries for FEI level tests are subject to EA rule 4.8.3.2. (see below)
- Entries will be ranked where oversubscribed

The Organising Committee retains the right to make exceptions in special circumstances for National competitions excluding rule 4.8.3.2.

Other CDI / CDN sanctioned competitions,

All scores must be attained during the Qualifying period: 12th Jan 2023 –11th Jan 2024.

- CDI3* Grand Prix: 62% or above on one occasion in GP in the qualifying period
- CDI1* Prix St Georges/ Intermediate I: 60% or above on one occasion in each level entered
- **CDI U25:** 60% or above on one occasion in Official Inter A/B or Inter II or U25 GP or GP. Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 25.
- **CDIY:** 60% or above on one occasion in PSG, Inter I or YR Individual or Team competition. Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 21.
- **CDIJ:** 60% or above on one occasion in Official Medium or FEI Junior Team or Individual in qualifying period. Open to riders from the beginning of the year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of calendar year they reach the age of 18.



- **CDNCh:** 60% or above on one occasion in Official Novice or above in qualifying period. A horse/pony may be graded at any level (Prelim to FEI). Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 14.
- **CDNP:** 60% or above on one occasion in Official Elementary or above. Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 16. Ponies must be at least 6 years of age.
- CDN Grand Prix: 60% or above on one occasion in Official GP.
- CDN Small Tour: 60% or above in PSG or Inter I.
- CDN Medium Tour & Intermediate II: 60% or above in Medium Tour or Inter II.

Note: FEI National Competitions: Under exceptional circumstances, High Performance riders on suitably experienced horses may apply to the EADC to waive qualification scores

The Organising Committee reserves the right to make exceptions in special circumstances in consultation with the EADC and/ or Selectors.

- CDI competitions will be held in accordance with current FEI Statutes, General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and Dressage Rules.
- National Competitions (CDN) will be held in accordance with the current EA Dressage Competition Rules & Procedures, Veterinary Regulations and EA General Regulations

Membership & Horse Registration

- Horses, Owners and Riders must be registered and financial with EA or, if from overseas, with their National Federation. Horses must compete under their full registered name. The Organising Committee has the right to abbreviate a horse's names for printing purposes.
- Horses must have a current EA competition license, be currently registered & financial with EA.
- CDIs: Athletes living outside of their country of nationality can participate with permission from their Federation and the FEI (Art. 6.1 FEI Gen Regs.)
- All horses entered for a CDI whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. (Gen. Regs. Art. 137). EA Horse I.D. documents are available from the EA National Office. Riders must ensure that they have the appropriate documents on arrival.  - FEI Horse and Rider registration: All riders and horses participating in FEI sanctioned events (CDI 3*, CDI 1*, CDI-J, CDI-Y, CDI U25) must be registered on the FEI database. Annual Renewal due 1/1/2024 Enquiries to EA (02 8762 7777) or renew online here www.rideahorse.com.au/fei-forms/
 - CDI 3* Grand Prix: For CDI3* outside Europe and North America, an Athlete may ride in three Grand Prix classes (Grand Prix, Grand Prix Freestyle and Grand Prix Special). The Grand Prix is open to all. The Grand Prix Freestyle and Grand Prix special is only open to the six (minimum) to eighteen (maximum) best Athlete combinations who qualified in the Grand Prix (FEI Rule 3.5) Note: CDI competitions subject to FEI rules 1 January 2024
 - Horses may be subject to sampling for Prohibited Substances in accordance with EA and FEI Rules.
 - FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Program: A fee of (AUD \$30) per horse will be payable for CDI 1*, CDIJ, CDIY & CDI U25 entries, for CDI3* entries (AUD \$40).
 - Anti-Doping: Human testing may take place. Refer FEI/EA Policy on Clean Sport [Clean sport here]
 - Insurance: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take



out a third-party insurance policy providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date

Objections & Appeals:

• Refer FEI Gen. Regs Arts. 163,165,166,167. Must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 150 SFR (approx. \$205 AUD).

Declaration of Starters

- CDI 3*, CDI 1*, CDIY, CDI U25: Declaration of starters: must be done by **midday** for competitions the following day. Riders who have not declared by midday will be considered as a starter for the competitions entered at the closing date for entries.
- Time Draw: The schedule for the time draw will be posted on the event website. The Draw for the first CDI competitions will take place as soon as possible after the Fitness Inspection.

Withdrawals

- During the event, all competitors who withdraw from a competition must complete a withdrawal form, have the relevant officials sign the form and hand it to the Competition Office. Forms are available from the Competition office. A withdrawal (scratch) fee of \$50 per horse will apply.
- Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after closing date unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the OC, less a withdrawal fee of \$50. Entry fees will be refunded in full as soon as possible for withdrawals (scratchings) before the closing date. Entry fees (inc. stabling/camp/ etc not used) for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition will be refunded after the event. Refunds for stables and camping will not apply for riders who decide to leave early.
- The administration fee will not be refunded.

Freestyles

- Grand Prix Freestyle CDI3* and Grand Prix Special CDI3*: A horse must obtain a minimum score of 60% in the qualifying Grand Prix to be eligible to start in the Freestyle competition. Limited to 18 horses, as per FEI Schedule.
- **CDN GP Freestyle:** The top 5-6 horses in the GP CDN are eligible but must obtain a minimum score of 60% in the qualifying GP CDN.
- CDI U25 GP Freestyle: Open to horses that obtain a minimum score of 60% in the CDI U25 GP. It is compulsory for riders to enter and take part should they qualify in the U25 Grand Prix. Riders may only start one horse in the freestyle.
- **CDIY Freestyle**: Open to horses that obtain a minimum score of 60% in the YR Individual competition. Max of 12 entries allowed. Riders may only start one horse
- **CDNJ Freestyle:** Open to horses that obtain a minimum score of 60% in the CDI-J Individual competition. Max of 8 entries allowed as per FEI schedule
- **CDNP Freestyle:** Open to ponies that obtain a minimum of 60% in the CDN-P Individual. Maximum of 6 entries allowed. Riders may only start one pony
- **CDN Intermediate Freestyle:** A horse must earn a minimum score of 60% in the qualifying competitions (Inter I CDI 1* or Inter I CDN) to be eligible. Ten to 15 combinations will be accepted to ride The Organising Committee may invite riders of the Prix St Georges (minimum 60%)
- **Medium Tour Freestyle:** Open to horses that obtain a minimum score of 60% in the Intermediate A or B competition. Maximum entries up to 10
- Advanced Freestyle. The top 10-15 placegetters entered in the Advanced competitions will be eligible



• Freestyle Music:

- Music testing times will be allocated only to CDI3*Grand Prix competitors who will be allocated a mounted practice time, riders must declare their intention to ride their practice
- For all other Freestyle Competitors, we will advise times whereby you can listen to your music to ensure it is correct

SPECIAL INFORMATION RELATING TO YOUNG HORSE COMPETITIONS

- Entry fees for the Young Horse/Pony include both rounds.
- To be run under the EA State Championships formula. Both round results may be used as qualifiers for State & National championships.
- Only Round 1 for 4YO will be commanded, callers for 5,6 & 7 are permitted for round 1. Callers are permitted for round 2.
- Age for all horses will be as of 1st August, birth date must be indicated on entry form

4 YO Championship for Horses/Ponies—open to Horses born between 1-8-2019 and 31-7-2020 5 YO Championship for Horses/Ponies—open to Horses born between 1-8-2018 and 31-7-2019 6 YO Championship for Horses/Ponies—open to Horses born between 1-8-2017 and 31-7-2018 7 YO Championship for Horses—open to Horses born between 1-8-2016 and 31-7-2017 All horses/ponies to be ridden in snaffle bridle, with the exception of 7YO horses, who may be ridden in a snaffle or a double bridle. Whips permitted in all age groups.

• The mark from the second round will determine final placings

Accreditation & Ticketing

- Accreditation/Ticketing: General admission passes will be allocated as follows: One pass per rider, one pass per groom (one groom per horse), one pass for one registered EA horse owner. This entitles the bearer to free admittance to the venue and to the general seating stands at all times (see note below). Accreditation (in the form of wrist bands) will be issued at the venue to riders, owner and grooms
- There will be strict control on the issue of wrist bands during the event.
- **No additional passes** will be allocated for horses owned by multiple owners or syndicates unless approved by the Event Director/s.

Stabling

- Stabling is to be booked **online** whilst doing online entries on Nominate.
- Note: CDI horses must book Competition Stables
- Stable costs see table below.
- All stables have rubber flooring. We suggest you order a minimum of 4 x bales of Shavings per stable. Extra bedding can be purchased at the venue or purchase with entries
- A stable bond of **\$200** will be charged at time of entry. Stables left unclean on departure will incur a \$200 cleaning fee, stables left swept clean on departure will receive a refund.
- Tack Rooms: are not available at this event
- No temporary yards of any kind are allowed.

• Arrival of Horses: Willinga Park will be open for arrival of horses from midday Friday, 16 February.

Camping & Catering

- **Camping facilities**: These are available on the grounds. Powered sites are available and must be booked at time of entry. There are excellent shower and toilet facilities with hot and cold water. All toilets and showers are unisex. There are amazing rider facilities including a swimming pool, BBQ area, washing machines and dryers. All camping vehicles must have an approved 15-amp lead connecting to power outlets. One lead per powered outlet only (double adapters not allowed)

General Information

- **Prize money:** Prize money will be credited to competitors/owners within approx. 10-14 working days after the event via **Electronic Funds Transfer.** Please ensure you enter correct bank details on the entry
- **Dogs** Willinga Park does allow dogs, but they must be on a lead and, in the care of a responsible person at all times. Please clean up after your dog, & **no dangerous dogs**. Fines will apply for non-compliance (\$120 for the first offence, 2nd offence owners will be asked to remove their dog from the venue). No dogs allowed on arenas.
- Transport: There is no public transport to the venue
- Exercise and Warm Up Area: Warm-up/ training arenas are available for use prior to competition. More information will be contained in the pre-event information emailed to competitors.
- Willinga Park Merchandise can be purchased at the venue
- Indemnity: Neither the Organising Committee (Willinga Park) or Equestrian Australia, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, grooms, owners, ground spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. All competitors, in entering, undertake to accept this regulation
- Insurances: The OC (Willinga Park) has public liability insurance through Equestrian Australia (EA). AUS competitors have some personal accident and public liability insurance as part of their membership of Equestrian Australia
- All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date



Welfare of The Horse – FEI Code of Conduct

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery, tack, and transportation
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they will be allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise

A full copy of this code of conduct is available on the FEI Website and included in the FEI Dressage Rules

Horse Vaccinations & Biosecurity:

- **Vaccinations:** are recommended for Hendra virus, in particular those that reside in high-risk Hendra areas. We also recommend horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date
- **Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration**: Information will be sent with Rider Information Document after close of entries.
- DPI Tick & Fire Ant information will be provided within Rider Information documents closer to the event
