Thinking About A Nip Or Tuck? Here Are 10 Black Plastic Surgeons To Consult

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Representation in medicine matters. Especially in fields like plastic surgery, where innovation, trust and patient experience intersect. The African American plastic surgeons highlighted in this story earned distinction through board certification, years of experience, leadership roles, awards, community service and innovative contributions. Each surgeon demonstrates excellence in both technical expertise and patient-centered care, while also paving the way for future generations.

Independent of the plastic surgeons chosen for this list, we consulted with double-board-certified plastic surgeon Dr. Nicholas Jones of Nip & Tuck Plastic Surgery in Atlanta. Certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery and the American Board of Surgery, he outlines the criteria patients should consider. "When selecting a plastic surgeon, patients should always prioritize safety and transparency," he advises. "The consultation is critical – not only to discuss your goals, but to determine whether you feel a genuine connection and trust with your surgeon. Also, make sure the surgeon you consult with is the one performing your operation."

1. Dr. Steven Williams

Board-certified in both plastic and reconstructive surgery.

Advocate for patient safety, new surgical technologies and greater inclusion in medicine.



Dr. Steven Williams served as the president of the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, making history as its first African American leader. His balance of surgical expertise, innovation and leadership makes him one of today's most influential voices in plastic surgery.

"Excellence is a blend of two things: technical skill and patient-centered care," he says. "The best plastic surgeons are not just operators; they're problem solvers and listeners." Known for emphasizing safety, education and ethical standards, Dr. Williams advocates for evidence-based techniques across cosmetic and reconstructive procedures. Beyond his clinical role, he influences national policy, training standards and public education, helping shape the future of the specialty.

2. Dr. Julius Few

Certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery.

Which ethnicity has the most plastic surgery?

According to the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, Caucasians make up the largest percentage of patients receiving plastic surgery in the United States. However, demand among African Americans, Hispanics and Asian Americans continues to grow. This rise reflects both increased access and changing beauty standards that embrace cultural diversity.

Where is the best place in the U.S. to get plastic surgery?

The best location depends on the procedure and the surgeon's expertise. Cities like Beverly Hills, Miami, New York and Houston are well-known for concentrations of board-certified plastic surgeons. Patients should focus less on geography and more on qualifications.

When choosing a top plastic surgeon, Dr. Jones advises patients to confirm that their surgeon is board-certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery, which signifies rigorous training and adherence to the highest standards of safety and ethics. "It can be reassuring to know that your surgeon is involved in advancing the specialty through education, innovation or professional contributions."

Frequently Asked Questions

Which country has the best quality plastic surgery?

South Korea is widely regarded as offering the best quality cosmetic plastic surgery, particularly in facial procedures. The U.S., however, remains a global leader in reconstructive and aesthetic surgery due to its advanced training programs and board-certification standards.

How many Black female plastic surgeons are there in the US?

Fewer than 40 Black women are currently board-certified in plastic surgery across the United States, making them extremely rare and highly sought after for their expertise and representation.

What is safer, BBL or implants?

Both procedures carry risks, but the Cleveland Clinic notes that the Brazilian Butt Lift (BBL) has a higher complication rate compared to buttock implants.

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
