Online Entry Registration Instructions

January 6 - March 31, 2025

Artwork must be registered online BEFORE being brought to the Fair.

- 1) Click here for [ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION](#). A Creative Kids button is also available in the Spring Fair section of the Fair's [Enter a Competition](#) web page.

- 2) Click **Sign In** at the upper right corner of the page

- 3) Choose **Type: Exhibitor, School** or **Quick Group** and follow the instructions.

PLEASE NOTE:

Exhibitors - use your first and last name and create a password. *When entering a school name, choose INDIVIDUAL.* Click **Continue** then click **Create Entries** (skip #4).

Teachers - may use **School** login and password from last year. **However**, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that **each teacher** create their own **Quick Group** and password. Use the teacher's full name (first and last) for **Group User Name**.

- 4) Click **Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries**. Enter Exhibitor's (student's) information. *Use the School or Quick Group password when inputting each student's information.*

- 5) Click **Continue** to go to **Create Entries**.

For each entry:

- Select a **Department** ex.: Creative Kids
- Select a **Division** ex.: Painting - Div. 100
- Select a **Class** ex.: Class 1000 - Tempera
- Fill in the Description, in detail, for the item you are entering (ex: Red and green tulips not just tulips).

- 6) When you have completed entering all your items, click **Add Entry to Cart**. You may now **Add Entries for a different Exhibitor (student)** or **Check Out**. (**NOTE:** If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. **Be sure to Check Out before the closing date listed; entries are not submitted to The Fair office until the check-out process is complete.**)

- 7) When all Exhibitor entry registrations are complete, follow instructions to **Check Out**. Fill in "yes" to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Premium List and click **Submit**.

CREATIVE KIDS INFORMATION

The Creative Kids Department is located on the first floor of the Pavilion at the Washington State Fair Events Center.

Creative Kids offers an opportunity for children 6 – 15 - years - old to exhibit their creativity and skill at The Spring Fair.

RULES

1. Entries need to be completed online by 10 pm, Monday, March 31, 2025. Print a copy of your online entry summary/receipt to bring with your items on **Thursday, April 3, 11am - 6pm or Friday, April 4, 11am - 6pm.** There is no entry fee. Bring your items to the north end of the first floor of the Pavilion. You may park in the Gold Lot and walk in through the Gold Gate. If you have large items, you may drive through the Gold Gate.
2. Mail-in entries will not be accepted.
3. No placing or award information will be given prior to Spring Fair's opening.
4. Exhibitors must be at least 6 - years - old and have not had their 16th birthday, i.e. ages 6 - 15 - years - old.
5. All entries must be the handwork of the exhibitor. They must have been finished within the past two years. No article may be entered a second year. NO SOILED OR OBVIOUSLY USED ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
6. Each exhibitor will be limited to ONE ENTRY PER CLASS; i.e., one watercolor, one peeps diorama, one non fiction writing. All items will be placed in the most suitable division and class.
7. **Group Projects** must be registered under a group name (ie. Mrs. K's class, Dynamic Duo, etc.). At the time of entry, bring the names of all participants and give them to the clerk. Title cards will be made to give recognition to all participants for the group project.
8. All first place winning entries will be displayed and every effort will be made to display all other entries. However, we reserve the right to withhold other entries from the display. This will only be done if there is insufficient display space. Any items not displayed will be held in a secure storage area.
9. All entries placed on display must remain for the full run of Spring Fair, April 10-20, 2025. Entries must be **picked up on Tuesday, April 22, 10am - 7pm.**
10. **Anything remaining after 7 pm on TUESDAY, April 22 will be donated to charity or discarded.**

Food items will not be returned. Baking Division award ribbons must be picked up on Tuesday, April 22, 10am - 7pm. **Ribbons will not be mailed.**

11. Although every precaution will be made to protect items, The Fair will not be responsible for theft, loss or damage to entries.
12. Neither paid Fair employees nor volunteers are eligible to judge in the department for which they work. Paid Fair employees or volunteers who judge any show or contest outside the department they work for must be pre-approved by their department supervisor. Fair exhibitors, including exhibiting employees, are not eligible to judge in their entry divisions.

AWARDS

Each Creative Kids Department having at least three exhibitors will have a Grand Champion rosette awarded to the most outstanding entry of that department for each age group. In Departments that have more than one division, a Best In Category ribbon will be awarded. There must be at least two blue ribbons in that division to be awarded a Best In Category. All items will be judged using the Danish System. This means each item is judged against a standard - not against other entries. Each entry is evaluated and given a placing; first (blue), second (red) or third (white). More than one first, second or third may be awarded per class. No premium money will be awarded. **Each exhibitor will be given one Spring Fair gate pass when delivering his/her entry on Thursday, April 3 or Friday, April 4.**

PHOTOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT

Photographs may be black and white or color. Prints may be self or commercially processed, and must be at least 4 x 6 inches, and not larger than 11 x 14 inches, including mat. Collages must be no larger than 11 X 14 inches.

Prints must be adhered to a paper mounting to give the picture the stiffness to be shown without a frame. Photo mount can be found at most photo shops.

No frames will be allowed. Matting may be done, but must not exceed the overall 11 x 14 inch size limit for the entry. Matting and/or mounting may be commercially done.

Your name may not be placed on the front of the matting or print. **Place your name in the upper left hand corner of the back of the print.** Work must have been completed within the past two years.

Contest Rules:

- One entry per person
- Diorama must include at least one Peep marshmallow candy (any shape or flavor)
- Scene must be created inside a shoe box (or similar sized box)
- Include the theme's name in your diorama
- You may use any material, except Legos, to embellish your diorama including (but not limited to): paper, cottonballs, other candy, cardboard, fabric, markers, toys, store bought props, tape, glue, etc.
- Diorama must be made to be moved and all props remain secured to the box. Fair staff will transport dioramas with care but are not responsible for the shifting of props and pieces in the process.
- Department manager has the right to not display or remove displayed dioramas that are inappropriate or not "family friendly."
- "Group Project" means done by more than one person and must be registered under a group name (ie. Mrs. K's class, Dynamic Duo)
- Ribbons will be awarded in each age class. Fair guests will have a chance to vote on their favorite diorama in each age group during The Fair. Votes will be combined with the judges votes to determine the winners. *Winners will be announced at 3:30pm on April 19.*

The dioramas are judged on the following criteria:

Theme: These are often film or TV references, books, video games, sports, etc. Think of the most Peep-ular themes for your diorama.

Originality: While Peeps have become more versatile, there's only so much you can do with the two basic shapes. Contestants who really find a way to create original master-peep-ce truly succeed.

Craftsmanship: Although a diorama typically exists within a shoe box, this is more about what someone can do with a small space and with the tools available to them in their apartment, house or Peep-filled castle.
