Grade Level	<u>1 – 3rd Grade</u> (Kindergarten during April-June)
School Year Dates	Mid-February through June. The Traveling Farm can visit schools located within a 50-mile radius of the Washington State Fairgrounds.
Location	<u>23' x 81' area for semi-trailer along with the ability to pull the trailer through the given area, the trailer is not able to be backed up . Area must be a hard surface (asphalt, concrete, black top, etc)</u>
Starting Times	15 minutes after school begins until 30 minutes before school is dismissed
Number of classes	Each time slot is limited to one class, with a maximum of 30 students—please do not combine classes. We require a minimum of 4 classes and can accommodate up to 6 classes per day. Smaller class sizes help ensure the best experience for students. To reach as many schools as possible, we limit each school to a one-day visit.
Curriculum	This outreach program brings a full day of agricultural and nutrition education directly to your school, designed for 1st–3rd grade students , with kindergarten visits available in late spring. The hands-on exhibit area is aligned with Washington State E.A.L.R.s and supports a variety of learning styles. Students will also have the unique opportunity to experience up-close interactions with real farm animals.
Teachers	Teachers play a key role in enhancing the learning experience and are encouraged to accompany their students throughout the program. Pre- and post-visit curriculum materials are available to help prepare students and extend their learning. After our visit, we kindly ask that you complete a brief evaluation to help us improve the program for future participants.
Volunteers	Volunteers play an essential role in the success of the Traveling Farm experience. We ask that each school provide three volunteers for the morning and three for the afternoon session. Traveling Farm staff will meet with volunteers 15 minutes before their shift to explain their responsibilities and how they will assist students in the exhibit area. Please ensure that volunteers do not bring children outside of the participating class.

The exhibit requires a hard, level surface such as asphalt, concrete, or blacktop, measuring approximately 23' by 81'.
The area must be accessible for a tractor-trailer to pull in and out. If you're unsure about a suitable setup location, feel free to email us and we can help identify the best spot.

The Traveling Farm is available from mid-February through mid-June.
