DAIRY GOAT SHOW RULES

- 1. Online entry registration is due by 10pm Sunday, August 3. Please keep a copy for your records.
- Entry fee is \$6.00 per head. ENTRY FEES MUST BE PAID AT THE TIME YOU SUBMIT YOUR ONLINE ENTRIES. NOTE: Animal's complete registered name MUST be listed on entry of each animal (herd name may be abbreviated).
- 3. No pop up shelters allowed in barn
- 4. Premiums will only be paid to the **top two**. No cross entry in any group classes are allowed. Group entries must be listed on entry form. All animals shown in groups must be entered and shown as individuals.
- 5. Exhibitor definition: All animals owned under the same A.D.G.A. member ID number.
- No animals other than does to be shown will be allowed; NO NURSING DOES, NO BUCKS, NO NEWBORN KIDS.
- 7. The Washington State Fair will provide bedding and hay. Straw and hay **MAY NOT** be used to re-bed trucks and trailers or taken off property. <u>This will be closely</u> <u>monitored and enforced in 2025.</u>
- 8. <u>All animals must remain in barns until their designated</u> <u>release time as set by the Fair and department</u> <u>superintendents.</u> Failure to do so or other violations of show rules could result in forfeiture of premium money and, potentially, the privilege to show at future Washington State Fair livestock shows.
- All animals will be inspected by the State Fair veterinarian before penning. No animals with any type of contagious or infectious disease will be allowed. The State Fair veterinarian has the final say, NO SECOND OPINIONS.

Exhibitors must submit Vet check-in slip to the Show Committee of their Livestock Department in order to unload livestock and receive parking hang tag. NO EXCEPTIONS.

The Washington State Fair requires that all goats be tagged or tattooed with Scrapie Identification. No tattooing will be allowed after unloading. Spot checks may be made at random by veterinarian or show committee to verify tattoos and ownership.

10. Certificates of registration in the American Dairy Goat Association, the American Goat Society, or the Canadian Goat Society are required on all dairy goats shown. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate, or on the stamped duplicate application. Persons showing animals whose registration/recordation certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the A.D.G.A. office must show those animals as agent for the owner shown on A.D.G.A. records.

- 11. As soon as possible upon arrival, please check in your registration papers and milk records to the SHOW COMMITTEE. Gate and Livestock parking passes will be issued at that time (maximum of 1 ticket for every 5 does entered per day). **Substitutions** must be within the same breed and class, and must be made before the day of show. **No class changes after final check in will be allowed.**
- 12. Show Ring Dress Code: All dairy goat handlers will wear white shirts and pants in the show ring. No shorts, hats, sunglasses or sandals may be worn while showing. Handlers are required to wear the correct ring number card for each class entered in the show ring. Fair Administration requests NO CHAIRS in show ring.
- Due to no milk out, over-uddering will be discriminated against by the judge when placing animals according to A.D.G.A. rules. Exhibitors should practice good biosecurity and not bring does with leaking orifices into the show ring.
- 14. All milk must be disposed of in designated areas and cleaning of milking equipment must be done in designated areas. No dumping of milk down drains or in hand-washing stations. No milk may be sold or given away on the Washington State Fair facility.
- 15. It is required that all exhibitors have some form of herd identification display, including exhibitor's name. NOTE: Only Washington State Fair ribbons, rosettes and awards should be displayed.
- 16. **NOTE:** Electrical appliances which draw more than 200 watts and are used for the personal convenience of exhibitors (kettles, coffee pots, pasteurizers, hot plates, etc.) are not allowed. Exhibitors are encouraged to use the dairy goat office's electrical supply for potential appliance needs.
- 17. Animals may not be walked on or off the Fair facility because of serious environmental concerns directly related to animal waste. Any animal (except horses) that cannot be transported in a solid bottom carrier must be removed in a truck, trailer or similar conveyance.
- Exhibitors <u>must</u> attend the Awards Ceremony on Monday, Sept. 1. Absence will mean forfeiture of awards.

19. Eating in the Barns vs. E.coli O157:H7 – Exhibitor Cooperation Needed.

Barns will not only have signage reminding Fair guests to "Wash your hands upon leaving any livestock area", but also "Please refrain from eating in livestock areas".

The State Health Department has asked the Fair to request that our livestock exhibitors set an example for Fair guests and refrain from eating in public areas in the barns.

NO EATING IN THE BARNS

BARNS AND STABLING

Every exhibitor should be interested in keeping the barn as attractive as possible. This cannot be done if each exhibitor undertakes to show his animal in his own way, and not in harmony with the entire exhibit.

An exhibitor is unfair to himself, or the owner of the animal they are exhibiting, if they do not always present the animals in the best of condition. This cannot be done if, for example, cast-off clothing, tents, cots, sleeping bags and empty drink containers are permitted to interfere with the general appearance of the exhibit. In this spirit, the following are not allowed:

- No butt fans or tents allowed.
 THERE WILL BE NO OVERNIGHT SLEEPING IN THE BARNS (no sleeping bags, blankets or cots in assigned barn space).
 - No dogs allowed in the exhibitor's assigned barn space. NO EATING IN THE BARN.

Attractive and informative signs concerning ownership and breeding are encouraged. The superintendent of the Beef Barn should be consulted to determine the most desirable location for them. No "FOR SALE" sign, or signs advertising any brand of feed or other commodity will be permitted in the cattle barns.

PERFORMANCE AWARDS

In order to emphasize the importance of a good balance of conformation and production in dairy goats, the Washington State Fair is offering a production bonus. All milking does placing 1st -5th in their respective milking class (classes 1007-1012) as individuals are eligible for an additional \$10.00 bonus premium if the following minimum production requirements are met.

Minimum Production – 305 day lactation	Milk or	Butterfat
4 years and older	2,300 lbs	80 lbs
3 years and under 4	2,200	75
2 years and under 3	2,100	70
1 year and under 2	1,700	55

Yearlings or two year olds in first lactation may have production paid on the projected 305-day records. The record of production may have been made at any age and need not have been made at the age which the doe is being shown. Only records shown on Dairy Herd Improvement Registry (DHIR) certificates or Dairy Herd Improvement Association (DHIA) official plan records which are supervised and approved by ADGA will be accepted.

The original ILR (Individual Lifetime Record) for each participating animal must be <u>turned in</u> to show secretary when registration papers are checked upon arrival.

DAIRY GOAT EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY AWARDS

To present an attractive display, as well as to educate the public and promote the dairy goat industry, premiums will be awarded to exhibitors. Only Washington State Fair ribbons, rosettes and awards should be displayed. Displays will be judged on the following criteria:

- General Appearance: appeal, neatness, and total picture presented.
- Creativity: use of color, material, and ingenuity of presentation.
- Educational: display should tell a story about the exhibitor's breed or breeds, farm, and commodity.
- Exhibitor: cooperation with other exhibitors and Fair officials, and communication with the public.

Suggestions:

- Have an attractive herd sign (required of all exhibitors) and animal identification (stall cards).
- Equipment and tack boxes organized, painted and in good repair.
- · Pictures and posters that promote the goat industry.

Large/Small herd sizes to be determined once entries are received. Example: Large Herd 15 or more does, Small herd 14 or less does.

PREMIER BREEDER & EXHIBITOR AWARD

In computing the award for Premier Breeder in each dairy goat breed, credit will be given in all regular, single classes. This award will be given to the breeder winning the most premium on his/her best eight head, including animals bred by him/her and exhibited by others. Breeder must be an exhibitor at the current Washington State Fair. The calculations will be made on listed premiums and will not include bonus premiums for championships, production records or udder placements. Entry is not required for this award.

The award for Premier Exhibitor in each dairy goat breed will be computed in the same manner as Premier Breeder on the top eight animals owned by the exhibitor. The calculations will be made on the listed premiums and will not include bonus premiums for production records or udder placements. Entry is not required for this award. Ties for both Premier Breeder and Exhibitor will be broken down in the following manner:

- Breeder/Exhibitor having the greatest number of 1st place awards.
- Breeder/Exhibitor having the greatest number 2nd place awards.
