ATTENTION SCHOOLS: If this is your schools first time entering, schools must request a login name and password from the Fair's Competitive Exhibits office at (253) 841-5150. or email CompExhibits@thefair.com.

PLEASE NOTE: School passwords used last year are still valid and can be used again. HOWEVER, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that each teacher create their own QUICK GROUP and password. Online Entry Registration Instructions

Artwork must be registered online BEFORE being brought to the Fair.

- 2) Click **Sign In** at the upper right corner of the page
- Choose <u>Type</u>: Exhibitor, <u>School</u> or <u>Quick Group</u> and follow the instructions.

PLEASE NOTE:

Exhibitors - use your first and last name and create a password. When entering a school name, choose INDIVIDUAL. Click Continue then click Create Entries (skip #4).

Teachers - may use School login and password from last year. However, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that each teacher create their own Quick Group and password. Use the teacher's full name (first and last) for Group User Name.

- 4) Click <u>Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries</u>. Enter Exhibitor's (student's) information. *Use the School or Quick Group password when inputting each student's information*.
- 5) Click <u>Continue</u> to go to <u>Create Entries</u>. For each entry:
 - Select a <u>Department</u> ex.: Creative Kids
 - Select a **Division** ex.: Painting Div. 100
 - Select a Class ex.: Class 1000 Tempera
 - Fill in the Description, in detail, for the item you are entering (ex: Red and green tulips not just tulips).
- 6) When you have completed entering all your items, click Add Entry to Cart. You may now Add Entries for a different Exhibitor (student) or Check Out.
 (NOTE: If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. Be sure to Check Out before the closing date listed; entries are not submitted to the Fair office until the check-out process is complete.)
- 7) When all Exhibitor entry registrations are complete, follow instructions to <u>Check Out</u>. Fill in "yes" to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Premium List and click **Submit**.



CREATIVE KIDS INFORMATION

The Creative Kids Department is located on the first floor of the Pavilion at the Washington State Fair Events Center.

Creative Kids offers an opportunity for children 6 – 15 - years - old to exhibit their creativity and skill at The Spring Fair.

RULES

- Entries need to be completed online by 10 pm,
 Monday, March 30, 2026. Print a copy of your online
 entry summary/receipt to bring with your items
 on Thursday, April 2, 11am 6pm or Friday, April 3,
 11am 6pm. There is no entry fee. Bring your items to
 the north end of the first floor of the Pavilion. You
 may park in the Gold Lot and walk in through the
 Gold Gate. If you have large items, you may drive
 through the Service gate off of 5th Street SW.
- 2. Mail-in entries will not be accepted.
- 3. No placing or award information will be given prior to Spring Fair's opening.
- 4. Exhibitors must be at least 6 years old and have not had their 16th birthday, i.e. ages 6 15 years old.
- All entries must be the handwork of the exhibitor.
 They must have been finished within the past two years. No article may be entered a second year. NO SOILED OR OBVIOUSLY USED ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to <u>ONE ENTRY PER</u>
 <u>CLASS</u>; i.e., one watercolor, one peeps dioroma, one
 non fiction writing. All items will be placed in the
 most suitable division and class.
- 7. **Group Projects** must be registered under a group name (ie. Mrs. K's class, Dynamic Duo, etc.). At the time of entry, bring the names of all participants and give them to the clerk. Title cards will be made to give recognition to all participants for the group project.
- 8. All first place winning entries will be displayed and every effort will be made to display all other entries. However, we reserve the right to withhold other entries from the display. This will only be done if there is insufficient display space. Any items not displayed will be held in a secure storage area.
- 9. All entries placed on display must remain for the full run of Spring Fair, April 9-19, 2026. Entries must be **picked up on Tuesday, April 21,** Noon 8pm.
- 10. Anything remaining after 8 pm on TUESDAY, April 21 will be donated to charity or discarded.

- Food items will not be returned. Baking Division award ribbons must be picked up on Tuesday, April 21, Noon 8pm. **Ribbons will not be mailed.**
- 11. Although every precaution will be made to protect items, the Fair will not be responsible for theft, loss or damage to entries.
- 12. Neither paid Fair employees nor volunteers are eligible to judge in the department for which they work. Paid Fair employees or volunteers who judge any show or contest outside the department they work for must be pre-approved by their department supervisor.

AWARDS

Each Creative Kids Department having at least three (3) exhibitors will have a Grand Champion rosette awarded to the most outstanding entry of that department for each age group. In Departments that have more than one division, a Best In Category ribbon will be awarded. There must be at least two (2) blue ribbons in that division to be awarded a Best In Category. All items will be judged using the Danish System. This means each item is judged against a standard - not against other entries. Each entry is evaluated and given a placing; first (blue), second (red) or third (white). More than one first, second or third may be awarded per class. No premium money will be awarded. *Each exhibitor will be given one* (1) Spring Fair gate pass when delivering his/her entry on Thursday, April 2 or Friday, April 3.
