# Online Entry Registration Instructions

**December 22 - March 18, 2026** 

Artwork must be registered online BEFORE being brought to the Fair.

- Click here for <u>ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION</u>.
   A button is also available in the Jr./Sr. High School Art Show section of the Fair's <u>Enter a Competition</u> web page, listed under "Spring Fair" tab.
- 2) Click **Sign In** at the upper right corner of the page
- 3) Choose **Type: Exhibitor**, **School** or **Quick Group** and follow the instructions.

### **PLEASE NOTE:**

**Exhibitors** - use your first and last name and create a password. *When entering a school name, choose INDIVIDUAL*. Click **Continue** then click **Create Entries (**skip #4).

**Teachers** - may use **School** login and password from last year. **However**, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that **each teacher** create their own **Quick Group** and password. Use the teacher's full name (first and last) for **Group User Name**.

- 4) Click **Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries**. Enter Exhibitor's (student's) information. *Use the School or Quick Group password when inputting each student's information*.
- 5) Click **Continue** to go to **Create Entries**. For each entry:
  - Select a **Department** ex.: Jr/Sr High Art Show
  - Select a **Division** ex.: Jr/Sr Drawing
  - Select a Class ex.: class 01 Chalk Pastel
  - Fill in all requested information for the class you are entering.

ex.: Title: Water Lily

**Description**: blue flower on black paper, blue mat, 11"x14"

6) When each student's entry information is complete, click **Add Entry to Cart**.

You may now <u>Add Entries for a different Exhibitor</u> (<u>student</u>) or <u>Check Out</u>.

(NOTE: If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. Be sure to Check Out before the closing date listed; entries are not submitted to The Fair office until the check-out process is complete.)

- 7) When all Exhibitor entry registrations are complete, follow instructions to <u>Check Out</u>. Fill in "yes" to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Competition Guide and click **Submit**.
- 8) Please **bring your receipt** from your online registration.

# SPRING FAIR JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW

### **APRIL 9-12 & 16-19, 2026**

The Washington State Fair Spring Fair is pleased to offer young artists from Washington State an opportunity to showcase their best work at the 36th annual Junior/Senior High School Art Show. Students, **grades 6-12 enrolled in a middle school, junior high, high school or homeschool equivalent**, are invited to participate in what many consider to be the area's most prestigious show for the artistic community's younger generation.

### JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW ENTRY GUIDELINES

- All work must be done exclusively by the student entrant, enrolled in a middle school, junior high, high school or homeschool equivalent, within the current school year.
- All work should be designated by the student with their name and title on the back, prior to arrival. Remove all name tags from prior shows.
- ONE PIECE PER DIVISION -

Students will be allowed to enter one piece per division (aka medium). This means that a student can enter up to seven (7) pieces of artwork, **one in each of the (7) seven divisions.** 

- For the protection of your work, all entries must be delivered in a portfolio or protective container. Students Name or School and Teacher Names must be printed clearly on the outside of portfolios and containers.
- Register entries online for each piece of artwork (see page 3 for instructions.) We cannot guarantee against spelling errors. Please type carefully and use proper case for names and titles when registering entries online; this is the source for display tags.
- All work must stay in the show the full run of the Spring Fair, April 9 – 12 & 16 - 19, 2026.
- Entries received by mail for the Jr/Sr High Art Show will
  be returned by mail or common carrier if the city/town is
  further than 30 miles away from the Fair. The Fair is not
  responsible for artwork that is lost or damaged in the mail.
- All work must be titled! "Untitled" is not allowed as a title in the show. Untitled work will be retitled under the discretion of the superintendent or rejected at check-in. We encourage that titles should be unique, individual and short in length.

 Framing Requirements: Artwork (except photography prints and stretch canvas with painted edges) must be framed with a 3-inch (3") thick frame made of poster board or mat board. Please ensure that the frame is uniform on all sides and the frame is mounted on top of the artwork.

Work not properly assembled or that becomes disassembled during hanging will not be displayed. Artwork entered with frames made of material other than poster board or mat board, glass or plexiglass, will not be accepted in this show.

- Stretch canvas will be accepted. The canvas edges/sides must be painted. Framing is not needed for stretch canvas with painted edges.
- Entries may be moved to a different class/division by the show management if the artwork is <u>incorrectly</u> entered in a class/division
- All artwork entered must not exceed 20 inches in height or 20 inches in length, including the frame.
- NOTE: 3-D entries need to have a stable base, to be displayed on a flat surface. Artwork such as masks, mobiles and collages must be designed to hang. Hanging weight may not exceed 15 lbs. Artwork that exceeds 15 lbs will not be accepted.
- Original artwork needs to be present at the show. We will not accept photos or replicas of the artwork.
- All pencil, charcoal, chalk and pastels must be fixed or sealed. All work must be dry at take-in.
- Although every precaution will be made to protect the art pieces, the Washington State Fair will not be responsible for theft, loss or damage to entries.
- The Fair reserves the right to reject any work it finds objectionable.

### **NEW for Korum Family Art Scholarship**

The Korum Family Art Scholarship Competition has a new format for applying. Beginning December 1, 2025, students must complete the online application, which will remain open until February 2, 2026. In addition, all applicants must **submit their artwork in person or by mail** to be eligible for one of two \$2,500 scholarships.

### **JUDGING & AWARDS**

The Fair wishes to recognize the effort our region's young artists put into their work. The judging and award structure is designed to encourage:

- · Overall program participation
- · Quality of work
- A diverse representation of the region's student artwork

### **JUDGING**

Artwork will be evaluated by grade level (6-8 & 9-12) within each class and judged on the following criteria:

- Use of medium
- Originality / creativity
- Composition / design
- Technical / craftsmanship

Judges will select the placing **for each class** and the Best of Division for **each division**.

### **PARTICIPATION AWARDS**

To encourage a diverse field of competition, participating schools and individual students will have the opportunity to win cash awards.

### **Student Participation Awards:**

Each **class** in a division may have a first, second, third and honorable mention placing/ribbon. Some divisions/classes may not have entries or win awards.

### **Best of Division Student Awards:**

There will be a rosette for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place, along with cash prizes for Best of Division, given to *three (3) senior high school students and three (3) jr/middle school students* whose art is the most outstanding in <u>each division</u>.

### Cash Awards:

1st place	\$100.00
2nd place	\$50.00
3rd Place	\$25.00

### **School / Teacher Participation Awards:**

Participation premiums will be awarded based on minimum participation requirements, and evaluated on the number of entries submitted, placings awarded, and percentage of participation in total show.

An art teacher (*program coordinator*) will be eligible for a \$100 cash premium, to be used for the arts at their school, based on participation and award points (limit of one cash premium per teacher). Up to 10 cash premiums are given for High Schools and 10 for Junior High / Middle Schools.



# **How to Flush Mount Photography Prints**

Prints entered in our exhibition require **FLUSH MOUNTING**. Flush mounting means that the mounting board or posterboard is the exact same size as the photograph print.

### **Example of CORRECT mounting:**



Regardless of the size of print that is entered, the mounting board and the print must be the same dimensions. So, if the print measures 8" x 111/4" it must be mounted on a board that measures 8" x 111/4". Mounting must **not** exceed print dimensions and prints must **not** have an overlying mat.

# **Proper Mat Framing for your Artwork**

# How CORRECT mat frame looks:



The frame should be a 3 inch thick border around the entire art piece and the frame should be mounted on top of the artwork. Only mat board or poster board frames will be accepted.
