Grade Level	<b>1 – 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade</b> (Kindergarten during April-June)
School Year Dates	Mid-February through Mid-June.  The Traveling Farm can visit schools located within a 50-mile radius of the Washington State Fairgrounds.
Location	<u>The program takes place at your school and requires setup on a hard, level surface such as concrete or asphalt, with road access to pull into the designated area. Setup on grass or gravel is strongly discouraged.</u>
Starting Times	15 minutes after school begins until 30 minutes before school is dismissed
Number of classes	<b>Each time slot is limited to one class, with a maximum of 30 students—please do not combine classes.</b> We require a minimum of 4 classes and can accommodate up to 6 classes per day. Smaller class sizes help ensure the best experience for students. To reach as many schools as possible, we limit each school to a one-day visit.
Curriculum	This outreach program brings a full day of agricultural and nutrition education directly to your school, designed for <b>1st–3rd grade students</b> , with kindergarten visits available in late spring. The exhibit curriculum is aligned with Washington State Learning Standards, National Agricultural Literacy Outcomes, and supports a variety of learning styles. Students will also have the unique opportunity to experience up-close interactions with real farm animals.
Teachers	Teachers play a key role in enhancing the learning experience and are encouraged to accompany their students throughout the program. Pre- and post-visit curriculum materials are available to help prepare students and extend their learning. After our visit, we kindly ask that you complete a brief evaluation to help us improve the program for future participants.
Volunteers	Volunteers play an essential role in the success of the Traveling Farm experience. <b><i>We ask that each school provide three volunteers for the morning and three for the afternoon session.</i></b> Traveling Farm staff will meet with volunteers 15 minutes before their shift to explain their responsibilities and how they will assist students in the exhibit area. <b>Please ensure that volunteers do not bring children outside of the participating class.</b>
