## MiraLAX (polyethylene glycol) Bowel Prep

4:00 p.m.	Gatorade, Powerade or Propel	wool) 238 gram bottle with 64 ounces of Water. Drink over the next 2 to 4 hours. every 15 minutes equals 2 hours.
With the first glass of the Gatorade/Powerade/Propel mixture, take 4 Bisacodyl tablets. <b>DO NOT CHEW.</b>		
If you are feeling sick while drinking the mixture, take a break for an hour and have some 7UP or ginger ale, then resume.		
**All products are available over-the-counter at local pharmacies (i.e., Walmart, Walgreens, Target, CVS, etc.)**		
Note: Please <b>stay home</b> once you have started your prep. Also, the use of <b>moist towelettes</b> or <b>wipes</b> may help to minimize discomfort during the colonoscopy prep.		
Results should be a yellow-green liquid (like Mountain Dew), and you should be able to see through to the bottom of the toilet. There may be some flecks of mucous streaks on the bottom, which is normal. The morning of your procedure, if your stool is not clear, please contact the location your procedure is at because they may have you come in a little earlier that day. ## **Clear Liquids Include:**

- Water and mineral water
- Any fruit juices without pulp (i.e., apple juice)
- JELL-O
- Diet or regular soda
- Diet or regular Kool-Aid
- Gatorade, Powerade or Propel
- Popsicles
- Clear broth or bouillon
- Coffee or tea without cream

If you are **diabetic** and are concerned about your blood sugars, you may take Boost or Ensure (without fiber) the day before the exam (up to a maximum of 3 cans/containers).

Due to the sedative medications that are given to you during your procedure, **you cannot drive home,** and you should have someone stay with you at home after your procedure for your safety.

If the physician removes polyps or takes biopsies, you will need to stay off Aspirin, Aleve, Ibuprofen and Vitamin E for one week after your procedure.

The physician will talk to you after your procedure. Due to the sedative medication, you may not remember talking to him/her.
