




The Flag

The national flag of India was adopted in 1947 as a symbol of nationalism and freedom when India gained independence from British rule. The flag is known as Tiraṅgā meaning tricolour and depicts the colours saffron, white and green.

In the centre of the flag sits the Ashoka Chakra, a 24-spoke wheel, in navy blue. As per Indian law, the national flag is to be made of khadi, a handspun cloth made popular by Mahatma Ghandi.


