

Suicide Facts & Figures:

Michigan 2020



On average, one person died by suicide every six hours in the state.

More than four times as many people died by suicide in Michigan in 2017 than in alcohol related motor vehicle accidents.

The total deaths to suicide reflected a total of 32,172 years of potential life lost (YPLL) before age 65.



Suicide cost Michigan a total of **\$1,501,780,000** combined lifetime medical and work loss cost in 2010, or an average of **\$1,189,058 per suicide death.**
