
ASE is **creating the next generation of world-class pan-African scholars** engaged in frontier research, promoting quality education and innovation-driven entrepreneurship for African development.

Background

Africa is undergoing an urban revolution; the UN estimates that the continent's cities are set to add 900 million more urban residents by 2050, almost tripling over the next 30 years. While historically cities have been the engines of economic development, rising incomes, and better livelihoods, this link between development and urbanization is breaking down in African cities today. Instead, many of the downsides of density are taking root: congestion, urban sprawl, slums, crime, and contagious disease. This is largely because African cities are growing without creating the necessary jobs or building the needed infrastructure to accommodate a booming urban population. New ideas are needed and the Africa Urban Lab (AUL) will be the incubator for them.

The AUL will provide both frontier knowledge and applied, practical learning experiences in realworld settings.



Offering flexible and accessible courses

Many students and professionals desire the opportunity to upgrade their skills and training flexibly and on-demand. The AUL provides such flexibility with modular course work designed with the learner's convenience in mind.



Building a network of city builders across Africa

The AUL will establish a 'community of practice' from which students and graduates can learn best practices, share lessons learned, and build up a network of urban professionals that will serve them well throughout their careers.



Program Fees:

Price for the full professional diploma: \$4,500 USD Price for an individual course: \$1,500 USD

Scholarships will be awarded based on merit and need.

Admissions to this program will be based professional merits. The application process will require a submission of an updated CV, a persuasive cover letter or essay, and an academic or professional reference. Upon reviewing the application, the admissions team will reach out to all applicants with the final results. Participants will receive a certificate for each completed module within the diploma and a full diploma degree upon completion of all the modules.

Scholarships

The Africa Urban Lab is committed to ensuring our academic programs are accessible to all high-achieving applicants, regardless of income level or socio-economic background. MAARIFA SCHOLARSHIP (African scholars)	This scholarship is dedicated to early-career professionals normally residing in Africa who work in both private and public African institutions and demonstrate exceptional excellence, leadership, and unique talents. This scholarship will cover tuition fees, airfare, and accommodation.
MASHARIKI SCHOLARSHIPS (East African Scholars)	This scholarship is dedicated to early-career professionals normally residing in East Africa who work in both private and public institutions and demonstrate exceptional excellence, leadership, and unique talents. This scholarship will cover tuition fees, airfare, and accommodation.
ZANZIBAR SCHOLARSHIPS	In cooperation with local governmental and nongovernmental institutions in Zanzibar, AUL offers scholarships to outstanding early- career professionals who are normally residing in Zanzibar and work in public or private Zanzibari institutions. Candidates must be nominated by their respective institutions to qualify for this scholarship. This scholarship will cover tuition fees and provide daily allowances.
MAFUNZO SCHOLARSHIPS (Tuition only scholarships)	The Mafunzo scholarship is dedicated to excellent early-career professionals normally residing in Africa and working in African and non-African institutions. This scholarship will cover tuition fees only.
MAISHA SCHOLARSHIPS (Partial living expenses and tuition scholarships)	The Maisha scholarship is dedicated to excellent early-career professionals normally residing in Africa and working in African and non-African institutions. This scholarship will cover 30% to 70% of the total tuition fees and living expenses.
