

## The 33<sup>rd</sup> Opération Enfant Soleil Telethon

The latest edition of the Opération Enfant Soleil Telethon wrapped up with a figure of \$16,724,819 announced at 10 p.m. However, the public's support didn't stop there. Indeed, the donations continued to pour in online, by phone, and from the valued partners of the cause, allowing us to announce a total of \$17,066,729 a few hours later! Thanks to the extraordinary generosity of Quebecers, more than \$2.75 million was raised on June 7 alone, which makes the 2020 Telethon one of the most successful of the past 10 years.



An adapted and largely pre-recorded formula was presented alternately on TVA and Facebook. The major Telethon team—production, hosts, technical, and Opération Enfant Soleil employees—had to start from scratch with everything they knew. There was no longer any experience or reference, and everything had to be rethought and reinvented out of a concern for preserving the soul and the essence of the Telethon. Mission accomplished! All the caring people involved in the cause rallied to the team and brilliantly took up this big, beautiful challenge. Thank you to the partners, the Enfants Soleil, the artists, and the volunteers for their invaluable cooperation. Thanks to TELUS and its partner, Thrio, which pulled off the feat of dematerializing the call centres, 300 volunteers were able to collect the generosity of thousands of donors in total safety in the comfort of their homes.

Although still little known to donors, planned giving is reaching more and more people. It is with pride and gratitude that we have seen this type of commitment gradually increase over the past four years.


We are touched by the trust that our donors have in our organization, our mission, and our values. Their generosity will have long-term impacts.

## The Provincial Hospital Tour

Each year, Opération Enfant Soleil visits the four corners of Quebec in the context of its provincial hospital tour to award the grants to the hospitals and organizations in each region. This is also an opportunity for the team to meet the Enfants Soleil families to soak up their history. Although the tour had to be cancelled halfway through, Opération Enfant Soleil honoured all its commitments to the province's recipient institutions. To adapt to the situation, the recipient institutions had the opportunity to modify the nature of the grants received according to the contextual needs imposed by COVID-19.



### \$2,701,015 awarded to the Centre mère-enfant Soleil du CHU de Québec-Université Laval

This amount contributes to the deployment of paediatric neurosurgery by allowing for the purchase of a 3-Tesla magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) device and the development of the premises that will be used to host this new cutting-edge device. The amount awarded this year is also used to purchase equipment to support the performance of complex surgeries and paediatric traumatology. An expansion of the operating room is also possible thanks to this donation, increasing the capacity of seven intensive care beds.









### \$2,660,996 granted to CHU Sainte-Justine

In particular, this amount contributes to the acquisition of GRAIL, an innovative gait rehabilitation technology that is the result of the Technopôle paediatric rehabilitation project. This ultra-modern virtual reality system allows the child to strengthen their exercise endurance in a fun and motivating universe. For caregivers, this tool maximizes patient care while ensuring more precise and personalized interventions.

### \$2,660,996 contributed to the Montreal Children's Hospital

This amount helps fund the purchase of equipment and the implementation of several projects that contribute to children's well-being, including the acquisition of the ROSA robot, an ultraspecialized tool used for neurosurgery on patients suffering from epilepsy. The grant also improves the program of surgical procedures outside the operating room, offering an environment conducive to reducing anxiety and pain in children. A portion of this amount is dedicated to the eating disorder therapy program, as well as complex at-home care. It also supports the implementation of the mobile communication platform, allowing for safe and simple care for clinicians and patients. Finally, this grant provides funding for the BAHA project, which assists young people with hearing impairments by greatly improving their hearing.

### CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS, Hôpital Fleurimont receives \$700,263

The creation of an Oral Immunotherapy Clinic (CITO) is possible thanks to this grant. The CITO assists patients suffering from food allergies. This amount is also part of Opération Enfant Soleil's continued support in creating the new Pavillon Enfant-Soleil. A total amount of \$10 million will be contributed to CIUSSS de l'Estrie — CHUS, Hôpital Fleurimont for the construction of this brand-new centre.



### Children treated in their regions thanks to your donations!

To support the regions in tandem with the four major paediatric centres, nearly one million dollars was awarded to regional health and social services institutions to—among other things—acquire paediatric equipment. Several recipient institutions were also able to modify the nature of the grant requested according to the contextual needs imposed by COVID-19.

## Over 115 grants awarded to regional hospitals and organizations across the province

The equipment acquired thanks to Opération Enfant Soleil's grants allows children to remain in their region or return there faster to receive care. The amounts awarded help adapt hospital care and equipment to the needs of children across the province.

## Partnership with the Ministère de la Santé et des Services Sociaux (MSSS)

In the context of the Fonds pour le maintien et le rapatriement des nouveaux-nés, as well as capital projects, 25 grants awarded to regional hospitals were enhanced by the MSSS. This year, a total amount of \$950,000, \$475,000 of which came from Opération Enfant Soleil, was awarded to support this type of project.

### Fonds Josée Lavigueur

Created in 2006 in collaboration with Énergie Cardio, Opération Enfant Soleil's Fonds Josée Lavigueur aims to promote physical and mental health in children through physical activity. The 2019 edition of the 5-Hour Cardio Challenge helped raise an amount of \$199,975 and carry out 52 projects dedicated to physical activity in children under 18 in several institutions and organizations. In total, 570 projects have emerged thanks to the funding offered to organizations by the Fonds Josée Lavigueur.




### Our donations by the numbers

87% of the revenue is earmarked for the four major paediatric centres offering specialized care to children: the Centre mère-enfant Soleil du CHU de Québec, the Centre hospitalier universitaire de Sherbrooke, the CHU Sainte-Justine, and the Montreal Children's Hospital (MUHC).

To meet the needs of the regions and provide local care to children, 13% of the revenue is awarded to health and social services institutions to acquire paediatric equipment and carry out various prevention and awareness-raising projects.
