**For the past 37 years, Opération Enfant Soleil has mobilized Quebecers to structure initiatives in over 100 hospitals and organizations that care for children annually.**

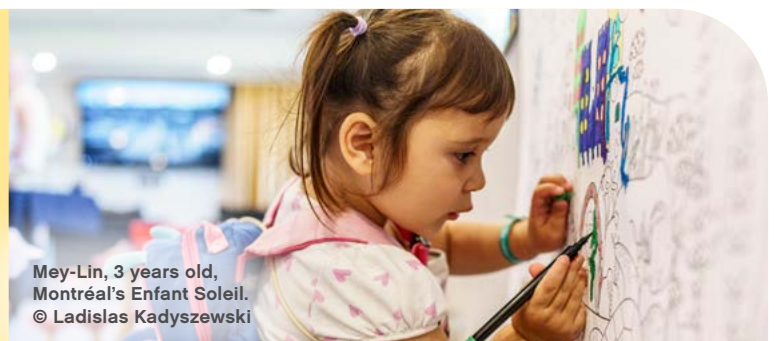
We act as a true spark, empowering healthcare providers to innovate and deliver the highest quality care to our children.

We can't wait to write the rest of the story with you to make our children radiate health.

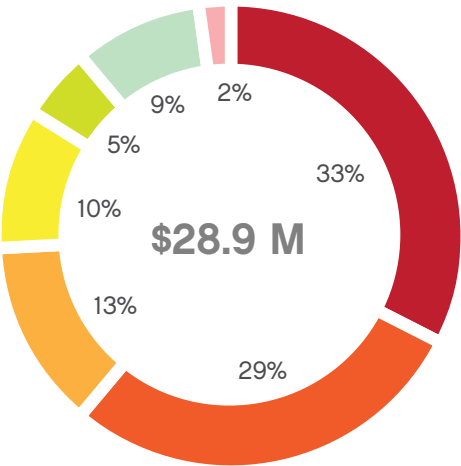

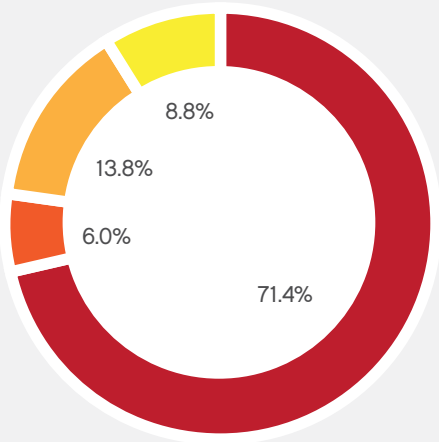

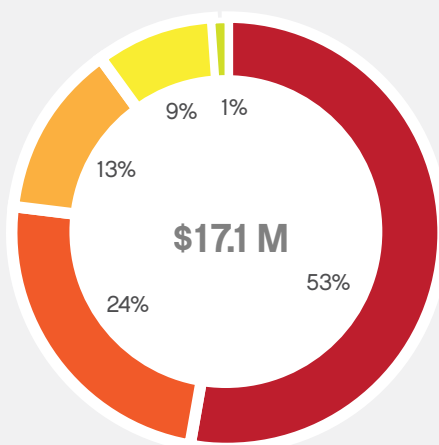

Together, we help them provide the best possible support to children facing illness, as close to their families as possible, to foster an even better recovery.

### Fonds équipement

Enables the purchase of state-of-the-art equipment and materials adapted to the needs and size of children.

### Fonds environnement de soins

Supports the sustainable development, renovation, or expansion of spaces designed for children, promoting their recovery.

### Fonds sport et santé durable

Supports promoting and encouraging healthy habits among young people through physical activity, healthy eating, and fostering emotional and mental well-being.

### Partnership with the ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux (MSSS)

Recognizing the importance of Opération Enfant Soleil in supporting quality pediatrics throughout Québec, the MSSS has joined forces with us to help us implement projects in regional healthcare establishments. In 2024, thanks to two strategic agreements, the MSSS invested \$507,936 in projects supported by Opération Enfant Soleil. These initiatives aim to acquire essential equipment to maintain or repatriate newborns in the regions and create optimal pediatric environments.

# Examples of funded projects

Each year, a volunteer committee comprising healthcare experts reviews requests submitted by hospitals rigorously, ensuring an equitable distribution of funds based on the needs and care levels of the facilities. The Opération Enfant Soleil Board of Directors then approves these recommendations.

## Montérégie

Hôpital Honoré-Mercier

### Unité d'intervention brève – Child psychiatry

Care environment **Contribution of \$160,000\***

The Unité d'intervention brève, a two-bed unit, is part of a new service model designed to provide rapid access to specialized mental healthcare for young people aged 18 and under in crisis situations. It offers a safe, adapted environment for high-risk cases, favouring short-term hospitalization. The purpose of this stay is to stabilize the situation, establish a provisional diagnosis, initiate appropriate treatment and, if necessary, consider more extended hospitalization. The benefits for young people are clear:

- Better care for youth experiencing a crisis situation,
- Reduction in emergency room stay duration and decrease in long-term hospitalizations,
- Improved care coordination in collaboration with services provided in the youth's environment, at school or home.

## Capitale-Nationale

Institut de réadaptation en déficience physique de Québec (IRDPQ)

### Exoskeleton walker

Equipment **\$85,000**

The walker with an exoskeleton is a robotic walking training system that supports the child's weight. The robots, attached to the lower limb joints, guide their movements.

This device helps children with severe disabilities to learn to walk correctly, while strengthening their leg, trunk and head muscles.

The first of its kind in Québec, this acquisition will help more than 750 young people a year to enjoy being active while contributing to research on the benefits of this equipment.

### Resuscitation table

Equipment **\$47,000\***

The resuscitation table includes all the accessories needed to enable caregivers to act safely and quickly in situations where every second counts.

This equipment is adapted to the size and needs of babies and can be used to respond to any critical care episode.

## Saguenay - Lac-Saint-Jean

CLSC du Fjord-à-La-Baie

### Multidisciplinary room for therapy and breastfeeding

Care environment **Contribution of \$19,000\***

The multidisciplinary room is designed, among other things, to observe toddlers and detect developmental problems at an early stage. Early detection promotes care and opportunities for learning, stimulation and development. The room also offers a rehabilitation area for a variety of therapies.

Access to this service for children aged 0 to 5 and their families facilitates regular follow-up closer to home.

Located in Lac-Beauport, Cité Joie is a vacation and respite centre for young people with disabilities. The Kartus wheelchair financed by Opération Enfant Soleil in 2024 contributes to the considerable improvement of activities requiring travel in natural environments, whatever the season!

With the Kartus wheelchair, the Cité Joie team can expand opportunities for the young people who use its facilities, notably by promoting social inclusion and outdoor activities, which are highly beneficial to healthy lifestyle habits.

## Clinical investigation centre and pharmacy dedicated to research

Currently under construction, the Centre d'investigation clinique is a project full of promise. It will provide the spaces, resources, and state-of-the-art equipment required for clinical research projects essential to therapeutic advancements in pediatrics.

Clinical research is **tomorrow's healthcare**. There can be no medical advances without research. By supporting CHU Sainte-Justine's ability to carry out clinical research, we are enabling our healthcare teams to improve children's health.

### Research contributes to:

- › The discovery of new diagnostic methods;
- › The development of new treatments;
- › The development of safer, more effective vaccines.

### Why is a pharmacy dedicated to research?

- › To acquire a fume hood to facilitate the priority preparation of research drugs in a sterile environment. This essential equipment will reduce waiting times for participating families;
- › To improve clinical processes and strengthen pharmaceutical team collaboration in clinical trials;
- › To place children and their families at the heart of the research activities in which they participate.

## The Intermediate-Complexity Coordination and Navigation Service (I-CCAN) service

Managing their schedule can become a real challenge for families of children requiring complex care and follow-ups with various health specialists. It's often up to the family to manage appointments, deadlines, follow-ups and the documents each service requires. It takes time and energy, in addition to caring for the family, working and living with a sick child.

The I-CCAN service was implemented to help families **navigate the healthcare system easily and facilitate access to coordinated hospital services**. Every week, coordinators take charge of the medical follow-up of young patients and help them book appointments. **Their goal is to simplify their lives.**

This program provides much-needed support for families of children living with complex and serious chronic illnesses who are medically fragile, technology-dependent and have intensive care needs.

### Inauguration of the new Unité des soins intensifs pédiatriques

In June 2024, the brand-new Unité des soins intensifs pédiatriques welcomed its first patients.

The redevelopment of the unit has doubled the care space and, most importantly, provided a more comfortable environment for the children and their families. In addition to a kitchen, a full bathroom, and lounges designed for families, patients' loved ones now have a space in their child's room to rest. Each room is also equipped with a private washroom.

These newly adapted spaces were designed to provide more comfort to families and, most importantly, allow them to stay with their child at all times.

Everything has also been designed to optimize the work of medical teams, with state-of-the-art equipment tailored to children's needs and workspaces that enable them to respond to any situation.

## Short-term intensive follow-up team

### No place like home

In Estrie, the majority of young people hospitalized in mental health services go through emergency services. The lack of suitable, rapid, and intensive options leads doctors to admit them to the child psychiatry inpatient unit.

### But hospitalization is not always necessary

The support of Opération Enfant Soleil has enabled the creation of a specialized multidisciplinary team to address the urgent and specific needs of youth aged 5 to 17 experiencing severe psychiatric issues **directly in their living environment**.

« Without Opération Enfant Soleil, our team couldn't have existed. The reports showed us that there were needs, that we could do more and that we could do better to help young people with mental health problems. Opération Enfant Soleil enabled us to say to ourselves: we can do it; we can offer better care to young people in the region. »

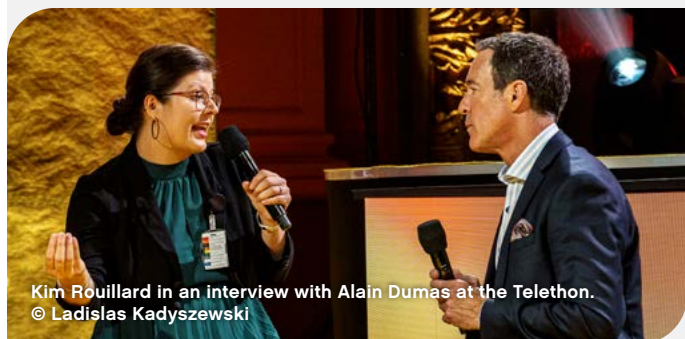
### For each of the 70 to 100 young people per year, the benefits will be as follows:

- › Be cared for in a familiar environment (home, school, etc.;
- › Reduce the impact and stress of hospitalization for the young person and those around them;
- › Encourage the participation of young people and their families in their care and recovery;
- › Avoid school discharge and reintegration, which can be difficult and stigmatizing;
- › If hospitalization remains necessary, reduce the length of stay in child psychiatry.

Although this approach is already available for adult patients, there has never been an equivalent program for young people in Québec. It's a major project that will bring our services closer to our young patients and better meet their actual needs.

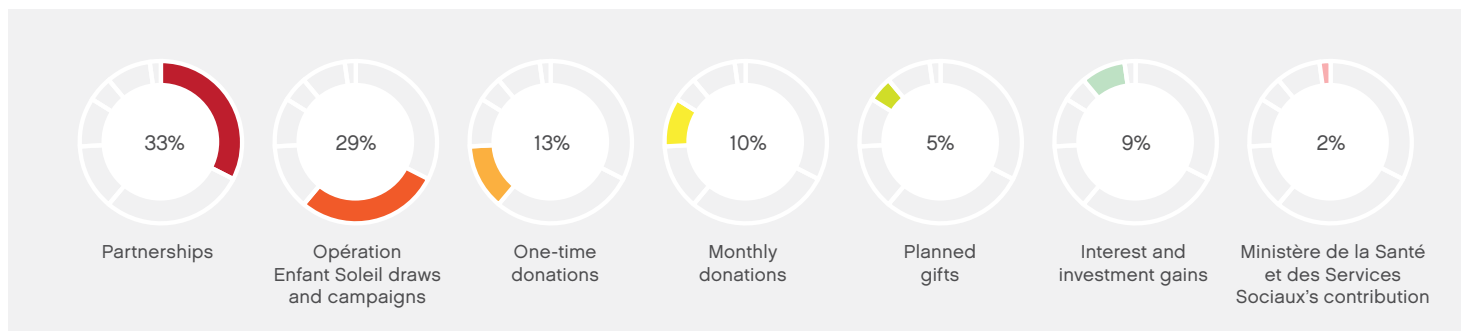
