Five years after its grand opening, ARRIVE Palm Springs has a whole new look. Although the entire property—from guest rooms to the bar and restaurant to the grounds was refreshed, the most notable change can be seen in the pool area, where new poolside amenities include daybeds and lounge furniture adorned with custom fabric coverings, living room-esque lounge areas, cabanas and expanded outdoor dining areas. Meant to highlight the hotel's natural surroundings with a more textured, relaxed look and feel, the new design features lots of plants (succulents, cactuses) scattered about, shade-producing olive trees, a desert sunset color palette and more.
