The Plan, The Future

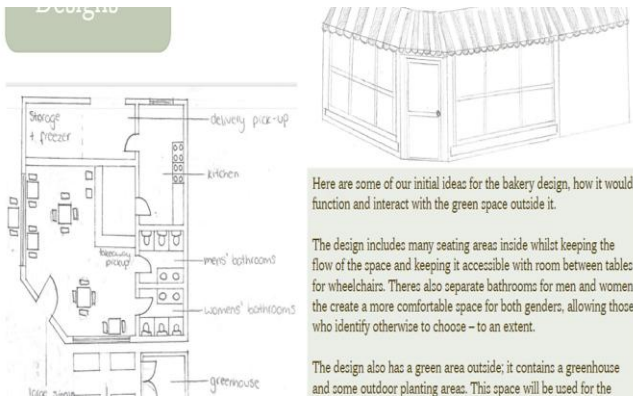
Across March and April, we delivered a series of workshops with Architecture and Interiors students at Cambridge Regional College as part of our wider engagement programme.

The programme included four sessions, designed to give students insight into real-world projects while building skills and confidence. This included a site visit to Cambridge Business Park, a design masterclass, a sustainability masterclass, and a design challenge. As part of their design challenge students proposed ideas such as amphitheatre with a screen, a community garden with a café overlooking, a bakery with outdoor seating, a train carriage café reusing old carriages from Cambridge North station and an outdoor stage located next to a water feature, alongside a community space.



As a final session, we invited members of the Cambridge Business Park project team to join the students for a careers discussion, sharing their own routes into the industry and offering practical advice about future career pathways. In groups, students rotated around the consultant team whilst learning about their roles, qualifications and day to day responsibilities.

It's been great to work with such engaged students, hear their ideas, and support them as they think about their future careers. Activities like this play an important role in connecting local young people with opportunities in the area and helping to inspire the next generation shaping the future of Cambridge Business Park.

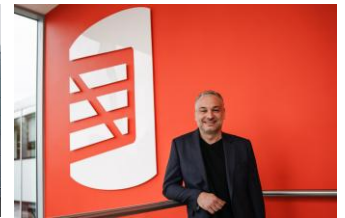
