Inspiring the next generation at Cambridge Science Centre

We're excited to be collaborating with the Cambridge Science Centre on a new interactive exhibit designed for children and young people to engage with renewable energy.

The exhibit is now open for visitors at Cambridge Science Centre, where it challenges users to build a sustainable energy mix using offshore wind, solar, wave and dam technologies. As players work through different levels, they must balance energy output and cost, including battery storage, to progress.

With built-in hints and real-time visual feedback, the experience encourages learning through play, highlighting the importance of making informed, sustainable choices about energy.
