Turtle Dove Cambridge is a social enterprise that supports young women aged 14-24 who are at risk of becoming not in employment, education or training (NEET). Based in Byron House, through its Alternative Education Programme, Turtle Dove provides a safe, supportive and inspiring environment where young women can develop new skills, build confidence and explore opportunities for their future. Thanks to the support of Cambridge Business Park, the programme has been able to make use of the Urban Room as a valuable learning space. The beautiful, bright and airy environment provides an ideal setting for the young women to learn, engage with one another and take part in a range of activities.



The welcoming surroundings also encourages collaboration and helps create a positive learning experience for everyone involved. The young women particularly enjoy spending time in the space and benefit from having access to the kitchen facilities within the Charities Hub. These facilities enable them to learn about food hygiene and safety before putting their new knowledge into practice, helping them to develop practical life skills and greater independence.
