How to get there



Public transport is the best way to get to the city.



You can use your opal card to go on the train, bus, light rail, metro or ferry.



You can also use your credit card if it is Mastercard, Visa or American Express.

You can also use your linked device.



There will be more public transport to take people into the city and back home.



There will be extra bus stops in the city.



Some stations will have a different way to get in and out.



Some stations might be closed in the afternoon and night.



Make sure to plan in more time to get into the city and home.



Ferries will not go while they get ready for the fireworks.



They will start again after the midnight fireworks.

Getting home



Public transport will be very busy.



You might want to wait until 1 am to travel home when it is less busy.



You may have to walk further to get to the train or bus.



You might have to go home a different way from the way you came.

Roads will be closed



Many roads will be closed on the night.



Taxis might not be able to get to roads that are closed.



There will be very few places to park.

What to bring



Bring your own water bottle.



You can fill it up again at the water stations around the city.



You can not bring any bottles made of glass.



You can not bring alcohol to some of the spots where you can watch the fireworks.



If you bring your own food use plastic boxes from home.



Put your rubbish in the bins.

Do not just leave it where you were sitting.
