Which vantage point should I go to?

Most vantage points are free this year, but it's wise to plan ahead and find out what's best for you. Visit **sydneynewyearseve.com/vantage-points** for a comprehensive overview on where to go.

There are many vantage points outside the Sydney central business district which offer great views of the bridge and barges and may be closer to home. Consider these when planning ahead.

Our event volunteers can help you with information about where to go, toilets, transport, food and drink, vantage point restrictions and accessible services.

Keep our city sparkling – leave nothing to waste

If you're packing your own food, use reusable containers and take your rubbish with you. Please recycle any packaging.

We encourage you to bring your own water bottles.

There are water stations available to top up at many vantage points.

We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which Sydney New Year's Eve takes place.

Getting to and from the event

There will be major road closures and parking restrictions on New Year's Eve, so leave your car at home. With thousands of extra services on the night, public transport is your best option.

You can use an Opal card, American Express,
Mastercard, Visa card or linked device to travel on all
public transport services in Sydney.

Transport services will be busy and the way you arrive may be different to how you leave. Pedestrian diversions will be in place, so you should allow extra time and consider travelling home after 1am to avoid the crowds. Be prepared to walk longer distances.

Train City stations have different entry and exit points

Bus Temporary bus stops and interchanges in place throughout the city centre

Ferry No ferries during the fireworks and some routes stop running from early afternoon

Light rail Timetable changes with some stops closed from mid-afternoon

Metro Stations will have changed access arrangements on the night
