It will help you know which one is right for you.



Make sure you get there early on the day to get a spot.



There are also good spots to see the fireworks outside the city.

9.15 pm Sydney Harbour LightsA light show from boats on the harbour




Midnight Fireworks

How to get there



Many roads will be closed on New Year's Eve and there will be very little parking.



Public transport is the best way to get to the city.



To travel on public transport you can use

- Your Opal card
- Credit or debit cards like Mastercard, Visa or American Express
- Your linked device like your phone.



There will be more public transport to take people into the city and back home.



There will be extra bus stops in the city.



Some stations will have a different way to get in and out.



Some stations might be closed in the afternoon and night.



There will be **no** ferries going while the fireworks are on.



Some ferries will stop running in the early afternoon.



Public transport will be very busy.



The way you come to the city might be different

to how you get home.

Getting home



You might want to wait until 1 am to travel home when it is less busy.



You may have to walk further to get to the train or bus.

Plan your night



There will be lots of helpers from the City of Sydney around to support you.



They can help you with information about things like

- Where to watch the fireworks
- Toilets
- Public transport



Pick a place to meet your friends or family if you lose them in the crowds.



Charge your mobile phone before you go.

This will help if something goes wrong.



Call **000** in an emergency.

What to bring



Many of the spots to watch the fireworks do not let you leave and come back.



That means you should bring everything you need for the evening with you.



You might want to bring

• Water and food

Suncreen and hat

• Rain clothes or umbrella

- Medicines
- Things to keep you busy while you wait like a book or games.

You can **not** bring alcohol to some of the spots where you watch the fireworks.

Help keep the city clean



Bring your own water bottle with you.



There are lots of water stations in the city to fill it up again.



If you bring your own food use boxes for it that you will take back home.



Put your rubbish in the bins.

Do not just leave it where you were sitting.
