***Please note that this information is only a guide and these steps can vary by plan and state. We always recommend you call the number on the back of your insurance card to confirm your specific plan reimbursement process.***

### United Healthcare general instructions:

- If you haven't already, purchase an annual subscription to NC<sup>o</sup> Birth Control [here](#).
- Login to your UHC portal, select "Claims & Accounts" from the top menu bar and select "Submit a Claim".
  - "Medical and Mental Health" > "Start a new claim" and complete member information
  - From the "Submission Type" drop down menu, select "Natural Cycles"
  - Enter the purchase date and the amount that is reflected on your Natural Cycles Itemized Receipt
  - Attach receipt and any other relevant documents requested and "Submit" the claim

Contact your insurance provider directly if you haven't received a reimbursement check in the mail after 4-6 weeks.

**Please note:** If your claim is denied, you should go through your insurance provider appeal process. Should you want to escalate the denial, you can contact [dol-ncc@dolncc.dol.gov](mailto:dol-ncc@dolncc.dol.gov).
