



In 2020, TDHNL Cambodia focused on sexual exploitation of children facilitated by travel and tourism and online, and reducing child marriage. In 2021, the focus will be on building the capacity of the police to investigate online exploitation through IT forensic tools. To further support indigenous communities in Mondulkiri, Communications for Development (C4D) activities will be piloted to promote sexual and reproductive health rights and raise discussions on gender based violence. In the future, the organisation's priority will be on research projects to identify hidden forms of exploitation and propose innovative solutions to donors.

- **570** families with children vulnerable to exploitation received emergency support
- **209** exploited/abused children participated in awareness raising sessions
- **381** vulnerable children received educational services
- **2** research studies on emerging forms of child sexual exploitation and **1** National Action Plan

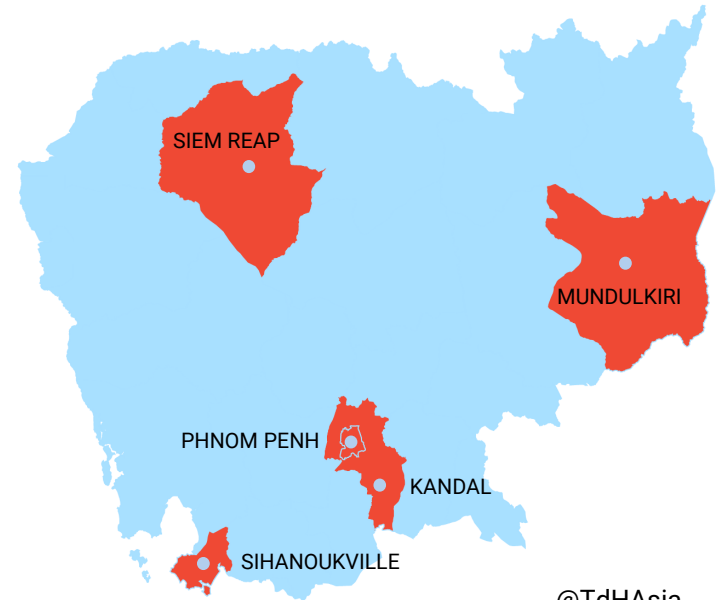
