- **26,169** community members (include community, religious and traditional leaders) participated in awareness raising sessions
- **4,560** families from Cebu and Eastern Samar received the COVID-19 family food packs and BCC materials
- **3,503** government officials sensitized on GBV and economic exclusion related issues with **37** local ordinances passed
- **1,801** children are trained to raise issues, how to report CSEC cases and advocate for child rights and protect against CSEC
- **162** CSOs received capacity development and support **46** CSO partners adopted/ crafted child protection (child safeguarding policy) and Gender Policy
- **59** effective referral systems established
- **37** Private Companies sensitized on CSEC

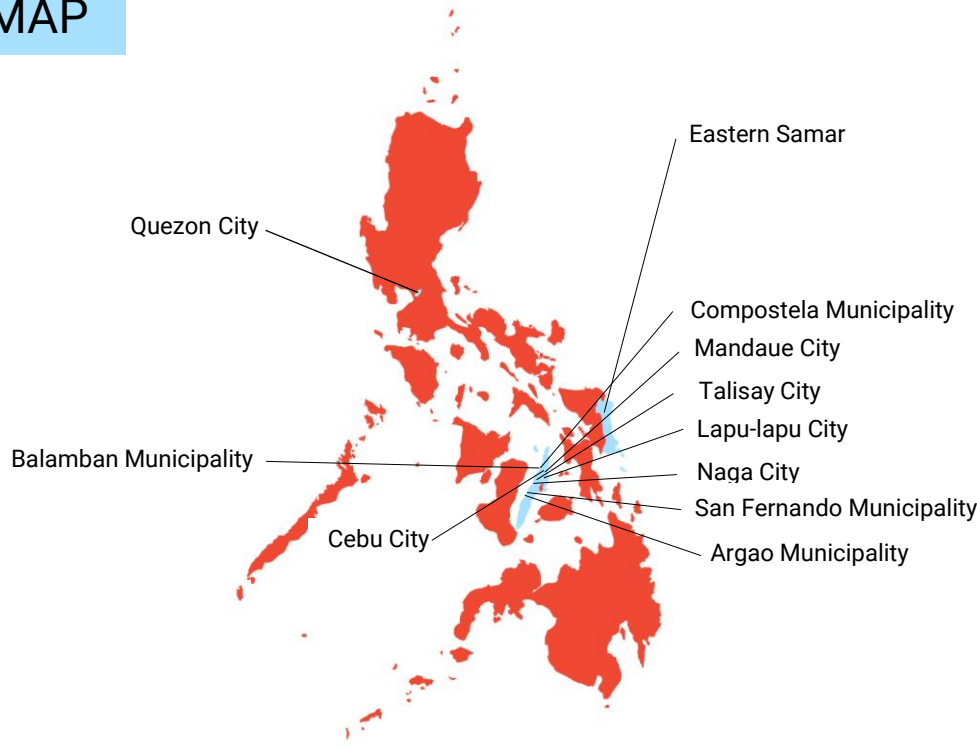
