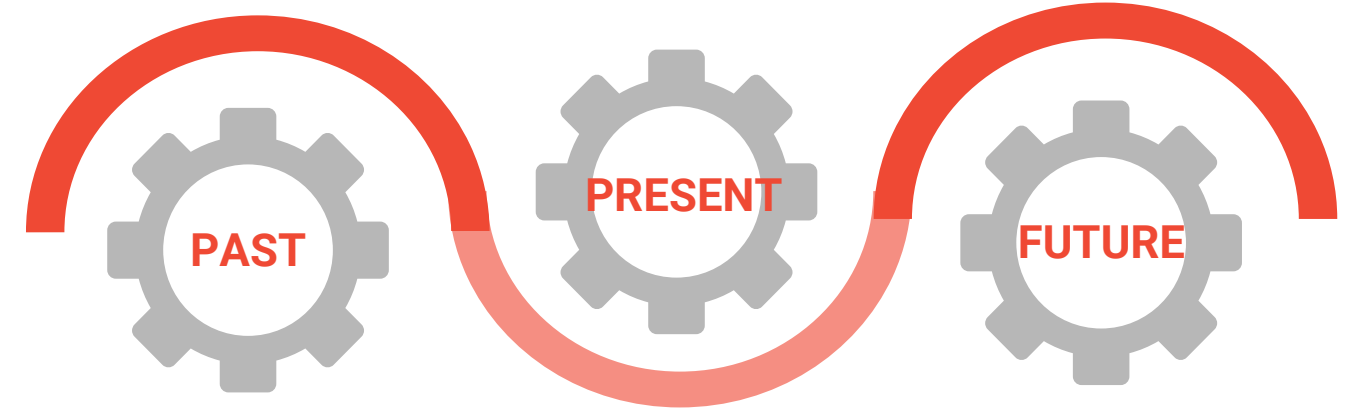


BANGLADESH COUNTRY FACTSHEET



ABOUT US

TDHNL started working in Bangladesh more than four decades ago, registered as an INGO with NGO Affairs Bureau and has implemented over 60 projects on both development and humanitarian assistance programmes with more than 50 local partners besides its direct implementation.



TDHNL in Bangladesh implemented massive ECD, primary and secondary education and TVET for the children and youth. Also, TDHNL Bangladesh involved in the health sector work includes preventive, promotive and curative health care and service through floating hospital; maternal and child health including water and sanitation. TdHNL had community-based Rehabilitation and Care that supported the HIV infected. In addition, there was humanitarian assistance through emergency response for cyclone and flood victims, including disaster risk reduction and programmes and supporting the Rohingya refugee population during 1991-1995.

Currently, TDHNL is working on ending worst forms of child labour, TVET for the youth, lobby and advocacy for policy change and its effective implementation. TDHNL Bangladesh is implementing projects on combating commercial sexual exploitation for the children of brothel-based sex workers and street children and addressing online sexual abuse and exploitation. TDHNL empowers early married girls and young people, prevention of child marriage by advocating for the effective implementation of the laws and policies.

Following New Strategy 2021-2025, TDHNL Bangladesh will focus on uncovering hidden exploitation, analysing, advocating, empowering and mobilising to address the issues that focus on victims, survivors and the most marginalised people. Besides, we will work on humanitarian assistance and private sector engagement that focus on ensuring responsible business.

DONORS

TDHNL has been fighting against child exploitation all over the world irrespective of their faith, nationality, age, gender, or culture. In Bangladesh, our work has been possible through the generous support from the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Netherlands Embassy in Bangladesh, the European Union and Nuffic. PRIORITIES & FUNDING NEEDS

TDHNL Bangladesh will seek funding in identifying and doing research for uncovering the hidden nature of exploitation to address the worst forms of child labour, commercial sexual abuse of children in brothel based sex workers and street based child sex workers, violence against children, child marriage, child trafficking, online sexual abuse and provide solutions with advocacy for positive changes. Besides, we will also focus on child protection in emergencies and climate change impact and seek funding for humanitarian assistance for both emergency response and DRR.

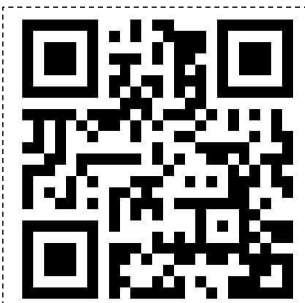

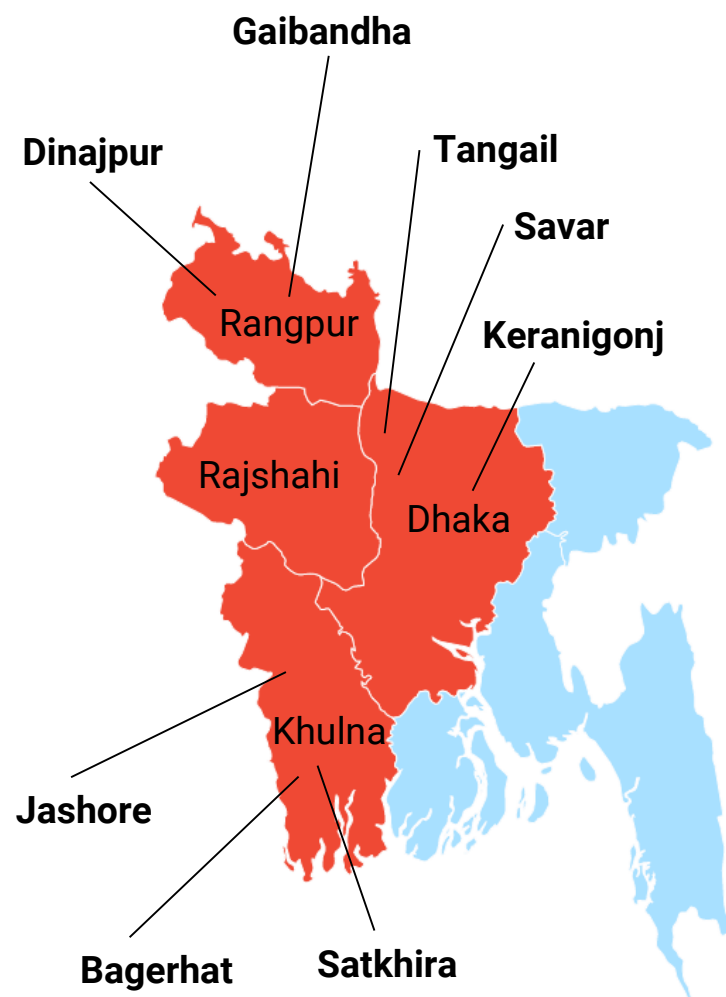
