# From the Pastor's Desk

To Guests, Visitors, and Parishioners of St. Teresa's:

Christ is Risen!!! This is the anthem at the heart of our faith. Our identity as disciples of Christ is rooted in Resurrection faith, His Resurrection, when He faced Death and said "NO!!!" In a most definitive way, Death has NO power over us, only Life in the fullness of the Kingdom and Paradise. We need to let this message sink in during the OCTAVE of Easter: the EIGHT DAYS after Easter Sunday that extend the celebration.

The number "eight" is significant in our Catholic faith and in the very architecture of our church building. Our baptismal Font is EIGHT sided; the stars in our Beatitudes windows above the sanctuary, the star above the statue of our Blessed Mother and the stars in our Washing of the Feet window are all EIGHT sided; there are EIGHT crosses etched in the four sides of our altar. The EIGHTH DAY of Creation is the Day that never ends, a Day on which the sun never sets; an entire day of Easter that never ends!!!

We are grateful for CONOR who entered the Easter waters of Baptism in our EIGHT sided font!!! What a gift he is to our church. And to VIVIANE and CRAIG who were welcomed into full communion with the Catholic Church, Confirmed with Conor and the three welcomed to the Eucharist for the first time... how much better can it get!!

Thanks to all who made our Triduum and Easter so beautiful: the musicians, cantors, servers, liturgical ministers, decorators and all the behind the scenes people who make our worship space so bright and clean and the landscapers who are about to make the grounds sprout with life and color.
