Seeking Ten Adults to Serve the Children of St. Teresa's

St. Teresa's Children's Faith Formation Ministries seek ten (10) adults ASAP to serve children in a variety of capacities. We have 7 vacancies for our Montessori-based catechesis programs spread across all levels (age/grade cohorts spanning age 3 through 8th grade) and all sessions (Sunday morning 10:30-11:50am; Sunday afternoon 4:30-5:50pm; and Monday 4:00-5:30pm). Catechesis meets 2-3 times per month from September through April. We also seek 3 new leaders for Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) during the 9am mass. CLOW gives children the chance to listen to and reflect on the mass readings in their own, age-appropriate setting. Leaders self-select about 3 Sundays per semester using Signup. com to choose the Sundays that work best for their own preferences.

Please note that our catechists and ministers come from all ages and life stages. Many are single or do not have children. There's much to gain spiritually from working with children! As all programming is now already underway, our need is urgent, and we hope the Spirit will inspire many to discern if they can serve St. Teresa's in this important way. "My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established..." Luke 16:25 – 26

When God created the world He declared that it was good and He gave it to all mankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

National Pilgrimage from Chicago to El Paso with CSPL

The first recipient of the Avila in Action grant, Coalition for Spiritual & Public Leadership, is in collaboration with a coalition of Latinx Catholic leaders and allies to embark on a pilgrimage to El Paso for a national teach-in and public action in El Paso, Texas, from October 11-13, 2019. These efforts were born among diverse leaders originally gathered to respond to the abhorrent conditions in the detention centers and the inhumane practice of family separation. The recent targeting and massacre of 22 Latinx people in the border community of El Paso brought to public attention the racism and hatred that still pulse through American life. This manifests in deadly white supremacy, in the dehumanization of migrant families at the border and throughout the country, and in a dangerous politics of exclusion and fear.

The teach-in, which will take place throughout the weekend in collaboration with HOPE Border Institute, will include workshops, trainings, and strategizing sessions.
