Religion in China Today: Back to the Center of State and Society

Sponsored by the US-China Catholic Alliance Tuesday, October 29, 2019, 6:30 p.m. Loyola University Chicago: Water tower Campus

For almost a century, Chinese leaders have pursued an agenda of top-down secularization, with most religions heavily persecuted or banned. However, religion is now back at the center of Chinese society and politics, with the country awash with new temples, churches, and mosques—as well as cults, sects, and politicians trying to harness religion for their own ends.

And now, at the same time that it is demolishing churches and detaining Muslims in reeducation camps, the government is promoting Buddhism, Taoism, and folk religion. What sense are outsiders to make of these seeming contradictory policies? Why did the Vatican reach an accord with Beijing under these circumstances? What does the future hold?

Pulitzer-Prize winning journalist Ian Johnson has lived in Beijing for more than 20 years,

following the country's search for values, faith, and new ways of organizing society.

The evening will include an opportunity to raise questions with our speaker.

How Do I Reflect on my Day?

I always hated how fast life moved. My many responsibilities often overtake my enjoyment of the moment. At its worst, life becomes a series of tasks with the deeper meaning of our lives sucked out by meaningless business. I found that taking intentional time each day to reflect has brought me into deeper closeness with the deeper purpose of my life.

There really isn't a wrong way to reflect as long as you make an intentional effort to. Writing in a journal is a great way to make this effort. I have found that the scriptures prove a good starting point to looking at your life. In his first letter to the Corithians, St. Paul writes "So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love." Looking back on your day, where did you experience the power of faith? What sparked hope in your heart? How did you experience or show love? I am always surprised what bubbles up in my day to day life when I use these three virtues as a prism to see my day.

God is the ultimate manifestation of faith, hope, and love. I believe that when I have a personal moment of faith, hope, and love, I am connecting with him/her in someway. Take some time away each day from a busy life of work and sit in silence and see how Faith, Hope, and Love move in your heart.
