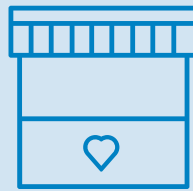

Your holiday shopping can promote Justice!

It’s a joyful time of year - the Christmas season is full of celebrating and giving. The Peace and Social Justice Committee invites you to consider shopping mindfully this Christmas season.

Below are some strategies for shopping ethically this holiday season:

1. Do your research and buy from ethical companies. Shop Fair Trade or from worked-owned co-operatives. Co-operatives are organizations that are owned and run jointly by members that share its profits.
2. If you’re hosting a Christmas gathering, consider services provided by co-ops. Two local co-ops you can try: Living La Fiesta Catering and LSG Cleaning Services - Contact Gabriel Lara (773) 757-8476 or gabriel@cslpaction.org
3. Use the “Done Good” browser or App to discover ethical brands within your online shopping
4. Reduce waste by using alternative gift wrapping methods
5. Introduce friends to ethical brands by gifting gift cards

6. Consider donating instead of buying gifts

7. The 30 wear rule: “don’t buy anything that you won’t wear/use at least 30 times.” Instead, consider renting or borrowing items that you’ll use infrequently.

8. Watch “The True Cost” documentary (available on Netflix) to learn more about the unsafe work conditions in the fashion industry
