The Least of These: Solidarity Stations of the Cross

A group of young adults will continue the new St. Teresa's tradition of our Solidarity Stations of the cross. Come for an interactive stations of the cross experience, calling us to recognize and pray for those who live the way of their cross in their daily lives.

Come and walk through individually at your own pace or walk through with a group.

Today's Gospel contains one of my favorite lines in the New Testament. When Peter, James, and John see Jesus transfigured with Moses and Elijah, they say "Lord, it is good for us to be here." They were surrounded by their lord and some of the most important figures in their history. It is hard to imagine the deep satisfying joy that they must have felt at being surrounded by them.

Think of a time that you felt a deep sense of joy. Considering all the struggles that people face in life, it can sometimes be hard to feel that joy. Try to follow the disciples' examples and savor those moments of joy. When you have a moment of closeness with God, say "Lord it is good for us to be here."
