## St. Teresa Food Pantry is Open

*In these unprecedented times, if you are having a tough time making ends meet month, one way to reduce stress is St. Teresa Food Pantry. Everyone (north of Lake Street to Howard, and west of Michigan Avenue to Austin) is welcome twice a month on Saturday morning from 9:30 to 11:00 am at 1950 N Kenmore Avenue.*

*Offerings include prepacked bags with meat, eggs, milk, fresh vegetables and fruit, and a variety of canned goods. There is no shortage of food and all can be served.*

*If you know of friends or neighbors or work with organizations where there is need, please spread the word and let everyone know that pickup is quick, a mask is needed and social distancing is observed.*

## Social Justice Accomplishments

The Peace and Social Justice Committee partnered with St. Josephat to accomplish a double-win: gaining new business for a women-owned co-operative and providing facemasks for communities in need. Through this project, we:

Donated 200 masks to the North Lawndale community by partnering with St. Agatha parish and Virtue and Voilure (a non-profit serving formerly incarcerated women).

Inspired four other parishes (Holy Cross, St. Francis Borgia, St. Eulalia, and St. Elizabeth Seton) to order masks for communities in need for total revenue of \$3,000.

Empowered Living La Fiesta, who generated a total of \$10,528 revenue through this project.

Helped connect Living La Fiesta with 105 new clients of the mask initiative.

Increased awareness of worker-owned cooperatives in Chicago as well as the work of CSPL as an incubator of worker-owned cooperatives.
