In these unprecedented times, if you are having a tough time making ends meet month, one way to reduce stress is St. Teresa Food Pantry. Everyone (north of Lake Street to Howard, and west of Michigan Avenue to Austin) is welcome twice a month on Saturday morning from 9:30 to 11:00 am at 1950 N Kenmore Avenue.

Offerings include prepacked bags with meat, eggs, milk, fresh vegetables and fruit, and a variety of canned goods. There is no shortage of food and all can be served.

If you know of friends or neighbors or work with organizations where there is need, please spread the word and let everyone know that pickup is quick, a mask is needed and social distancing is observed.

St. Teresa's Peace and Social Justice Committee is partnering with the Coalition for Spiritual and Public Leadership (CSPL) to promote economic justice by supporting worker-owned cooperative development.

What is a cooperative?

Cooperatives are people-centred enterprises jointly owned by workers. They are democratically controlled by and for their members to realize their common socio-economic needs and aspirations. As enterprises based on values and principles, cooperatives put fairness and equality

first allowing people to create sustainable enterprises that generate long-term jobs and prosperity. Managed by producers, users or workers, cooperatives are run according to the 'one member, one vote' rule. (<https://www.ica.coop/en>)

Your Vote Matters

This is an election year and this year, in lieu of the Hunger Walk, the Greater Chicago Food Depository is running a program in conjunction with partner agencies, like the St. Teresa Food Pantry, to get out the vote by helping folks with Voter Registration, Early Voting and Mail In Ballots. This Get Out the Vote campaign is not political and not tied to a particular party or candidate but rather is simply trying to help folks participate in our democracy by voting.

This aligns well with our community at St. Teresa and we believe that participating in this program is good for our parish, the guests at our Food Pantry and our community. Voting information and registration will be available to guests at the food pantry as well as parishioners and folks in the neighborhood. In order to be successful, we need some volunteers to help with this. Participation will mean attending a couple of training sessions (one hour each and they are online) and then volunteering one or more Saturdays in the fall during the Food Pantry hours (Saturday mornings) to help with this program.
