As we prepare for the inauguration next Tuesday, let us pray for a peaceful transition of power. Given the horrific events of the insurrection of the capitol last Wednesday, let us pray that peace and calm descend upon our nation. In the midst of this pandemic, we need a new beginning that can only happen with new leadership. Let us pray for soon to be President Biden and Vice President Harris.

Yesterday, the Parish Council met and we had a wonderful meeting discussing how Christmas went, welcoming new people, the events at the capitol, and how to make registering for Sunday mass can be easier. I'm sorry if any of you have had any problems trying to sign up for the 10:00 am Sunday Mass. Hopefully, a new template on our website will be clearer for all

I would like to dedicate this Sunday's Mass to Martin Luther King as we honor his memory and his dream of a new world built on justice. We need his witness these days more than ever. Let us celebrate his life and legacy.

Ash Wednesday is just around the corner. The archdiocese is discussing how we can celebrate this day beginning of Lent in ways that are safe but also respect the need for ritual. I'm hoping we can find a way to begin Lent rooted in the ancient ritual of the imposition of ashes. When I was in Rome during my sabbatical back in 2013, which occurred during Lent, the Italians celebrate the signing of the ashes by sprinkling ashes on top of your head. The only way people would know you got your ashes is if you were bald!!!

This is actually an ancient, and beautiful, way of engaging this ritual. After all, the gospel of Matthew that is proclaimed just before the ashes are distributed has Jesus telling us NOT to let anyone know that we are fasting, praying or giving alms. Perhaps, just sprinkling some ashes on the top of your head is a bit more humble.

Come to Adoration on Tuesday evenings from 6:00 pm until 7:30. This is a great opportunity to spend some time before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Spending just ten minutes in quiet prayer can make all the difference in rooting us in God's presence.
