A Letter from Fr. Frank

This year, the Feast of the Assumption falls on a Sunday (August 15th), a rare occurrence. This is a wonderful time for the Church and our parish to gather in celebration to honor our Blessed Mother, given the extraordinary gift of being welcomed into the Kingdom, body and soul. This Feast is a celebration of the Easter Mystery extended to one of us. Only Jesus and Mary have experienced the totality of the Resurrection: our transformed bodies and souls "rise" together, integrated and united forever. Our identity, created in God's likeness and image, is not just our soul, but our bodies, united with our souls.

Our destiny is celebrated in Mary's Assumption. We will ALL be "assumed" body and soul into heaven. The two Masses, 10:00am and 6:00 pm, will celebrate this great feast of joy, of life, of beauty.

After the liturgies we will have a simple social to extend the celebration. A beautiful tradition on the Assumption is to bless the harvest of fruits and vegetables. Bring your fruits and vegetables as a way to give thanks for the bounty of harvest. They will be blessed in gratitude.

On most Tuesdays evenings I will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, from 6:00 pm until 7:00. This will occur during Adoration, allowing one to begin in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. I will be in the gathering space so as not to disrupt the quiet prayer in church. I can also bring anyone home bound Holy Communion and the Anointing of the Sick.

Personal prayer before the Blessed Sacrament and celebrating Reconciliation are ways to deepen one's relationship with Christ. Developing a consistent relationship with Mary will also draw one closer to Christ. If you are interested in drawing closer to Mary through prayer and an act of Consecration, please let me know.

Caring for the well being of our bodies is very much a part of meaning of the Assumption, for the health of the body is the foundation for the health of the soul.

If you aren't vaccinated PLEASE consider getting vaccinated as soon as possible. The more people are vaccinated, the better we will be able to fight the variants that seem to be developing quite rapidly. Getting vaccinated is the best way to care for your own health and the health of everyone else you come into contact with. Obviously check with your doctor for further guidance.
