Letter From Fr. Frank

On Sunday, October 17th, the Noon Mass will resume, as we celebrate the Feast of St. Teresa of Avila. The main celebration will be at the Noon with a social afterwards to celebrate our patron Saint.

I plan on asking the people who attend the 6:00 pm Mass if they might prefer an earlier time, allowing for more flexibility in the evening. I personally have no opinion as to the time, since my schedule on Sunday's is wide open.

On Sunday October 3 we will celebrate the Transitus of St. Francis of Assisi, when the Church remembers the "transition" of St Francis from his death into eternal life. His Feast is October 4th. As part of the celebration I would like to introduce the possibility of starting an adult spirituality, faith sharing group, meeting perhaps monthly to come together and nurture our spirituality and Catholic faith. My hope is that we can come together and explore the ways that culture can deepen our relationship with Christ and each other: through books, art, music, drama.

I came across a wonderful book by Terence Ward, a journalist who writes about Inter religious and peace initiatives, about how he and his wife are transformed by a painting by Caravaggio and an unlikely encounter with a local man from Naples, Italy in the church where this painting hangs. Various lives intersect in ways that surprise and unsettle how life and faith are experienced.


