Questions to ponder heading into 2022 that will gently lead us to the Lenten Season

As we leave the season of gift giving and enter a new year, we are reminded that everything is a gift: our lives, our bodies, our families and friends, our talents, our possessions, the land we cultivate, the air we breath, the water we drink... EVERYTHING and EVERYONE is a gift!!!! We possess NOTHING, for everything is on loan to us, by God, which includes the home we live in and the property we "own." Ultimately, we own nothing.

Difficult words to swallow but the truth that emanates from the gospel. In teaching and example, Christ shows us that God has entrusted to us our lives and the lives of every human being, the earth, creation, calling is to see everything as gift to be treasured and blessed, not as property to be manipulated and dominated. We have so distorted the story of Creation in the Book of Genesis, mistranslating the word "domination" to give license to abuse of the land and environment. Particularly in the West, we have come to see the created world, including human beings, as objects to be controlled and "owned."

The Benedictine community of monks and nuns have had as the foundation of their lives of prayer and praise a deep love and reverence for the earth and all of God's creation. This most certainly includes animals, plants, vegetation, oceans, rivers and streams. The Benedictines see themselves as "stewards" of creation. Throughout their over 1,500 year history, they have treasured creation and their relationship with God's Creation. Yes.... Relationship!!

Let us begin this year as individuals, families and as a parish to honestly look at how treat the environment and what our relationship is with everything and everyone we encounter. Have we taken our possessions for granted? Do our possessions possess us? Do we care about over consuming? Can we simplify our lives? Do we treat everyone we encounter, especially the ones we don't like, with respect? Has our love of another become possessive and manipulative? Do we make good use of time, seeing time as another God given gift? - Fr. Frank


