# **Parish Life**

#### **Prison Ministry**

This weekend I will introduce a new ministry for our parish: One Parish One Prisioner (OPOP) sponsored by Underground Ministries. This ministry allows our parish to accompany an indivudual being released from being incarcerated, in such a way that this person can be supported in this time of transition. We are there to help the indivudual, not save him or make him better. All of us are vulnerable in some untold way in our own lives, realities that make us insecure, creating feelings of anxiety and lonliness.

#### The Synod in Rome

This past weekend I introduced the upcoming Synod in Rome, October of 2022. This Synod will be a gathering of church leaders coming together after a period of listening to parishioners from every parish in the world. A church of "synod" is a church that first LISTENS, PRAYS, JUDGES and the ACTS. Instead of taking a "vertical" or too down approach, a synod takes a "horizontal" approach. From the bottom, lived experience of the people, working upwars to the leaders. The whole process is LISTENING to the SPIRIT of Christ, praying, then listening to each other. The key in mind of this Synod is how we, as a people, are evangelizing the world. HOw can our church structures and minitres better proclaim the gosepel of Christ. The laity will be asked to participate by praying over some questions and responding via a website that will be made known. I hope and pray every parishioner will respond. We are at a massive turning point in our Church, as to how to live and pray as a church and how decisions are made. That focus must be on Baptims and the responsibilites we accept as baptized disiples. We ALL have the responsibility of preaching and teaching the faith, in way unique to our talents and disposition. This is an exciting time for our church as we let go of our medieval structures and ways of expressing our Catholic faith, letting the Spirit refashion our structures. Our church must "read the signs of the times", challenging us to embrace the new ways of getting the message out.

#### RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the RCIA, has been renamed the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, OCIA. The name of this essential ministry of the Church now matches all the other ministries. This ministry of forming and preparing people in Baptism will be a part of ALL the other ministries, and not something seperate, on its own. For example, we have the Order of Reconciliation, the Order of Marriage, the Order of Christian Funeral, the Order of Baptism of Children. Christian Initiation involes a number of "rites" and rituals. The new name simply incorporates initiation adults with the other sacramental celebrations and rites. Nothing of substance has changed. Given the importance of this ministry and its relevance to the Synod, I would like to create a team of parishioners interested in accompanying individuals who are interested in being baptized, of which are baptized but desire full comminion with the Catholic Church. We need to have this ministry in our parish, so please let me know if you are interested. The qualifications: basic knowledge of the Catholic faith, a deep passion of making the journey with someone who is truly interested in Catholicism, the ability to listen without judgement.


