Fiscal 2022 Recap July-December

As outlined in the table, St. Teresa's net income for the six months ended December 31, 2021 equaled \$202K. For purpose of analysis, results have been segregated between Net Ordinary and Net Other, consistent with Archdiocease of Chicago financial reporting guidelines. Investment earnings also have been reported seperately.

Net Ordinary: Net Ordinary results excluding investment earnings, equlaed \$109k, \$66k below last year and 13k below budget. The decreases reflect lower collections and higher expenses, largely due to higher personnel, events, and maintenance costs. Fundraising revenue, largely a function of Together in Joy, exceeded budget but fell below last year's record level.

Net Other: Net Other results include activities which tend to be irregular (e.g. revenue from bequests) ad equaled \$14k, 46k above last year and \$40k better than budget. The favorable variances largely result from the absensce of capital expenditures in the first half of the fiscal year.

Investment Earnings: The highter investment earnings result from the previously disclosed February 2021 shift of certain assets from a Certificate of Deposit to the Archdiocese's Growth Fund. The Growth Fund involves more risk and greater volatility than our prior investment but is expected to generate higher returns over the long-term.

Looking Ahead: As noted above, fundraising revenue is largely generated in the second quarter. As a result, the budget for the second half of the fiscal year forecasts a net loss of \$82l (excluding investment results). All other things being equal, this loss may be \$20-25k larger if weekly collections continue to fall below budget and last year.
