Parish Life

The Noon Mass:

Back in October, I started celebrating the Noon Mass in addition to the 10am and 6pm Masses. I expected a large number, since before Covid, the Noon Mass regulary had nearly 160 people attending. We are averaging about 30-35 at present. I planned on canceling but am very hesitant to do so, especially with Lent approaching. Consequently, I plan on keeping the Noon Mass until the end of March. If the numbers are still below 70 or so, the Mass will be discontined. I am praying hard that the Noon Mass remains a part of our Sunday Eucharist commitment. If you able, please come back to in person Mass. The environment is safe and we need our attendance to increase. Receiving the Eucharist, Holy Communion, is at the heart of our Catholic faith. If it's at all possible, please come back. I can even have the large screen in the Parish Center streaming the Mass. While it's not the same as being inside the church, its something and you will be able to receive the Eucharist.

Mardi Gras:

The week before Ash Wednesday is Mardi Gras, a time of feasting and celebrating before the solemn season of Lent quietly begins on March 2. Given what we have been going through, start Mardi Gras NOW!! Celebrate and let it rip, just a bit. The Tuesday before, March1, we will be offering Paczkis (Poonchkees) throughout the day. I might even celebrate Mass before Adoration and burn the palms right after Mass. Have a Paczki and pray before the Blessed Sacrament as a way to peacefully begin Lent. The Sunday before February 27th, I hope to have some type of Mardi Gras Celebration.

Last Years Palms:

Please bring in last years Palms to church. I will have a basket in which you can place your dried out palms. We burn last years Palms to create the crossed etched on your foreheads. This celebrates the cycels of the Liturgical seasons, a continual connection with the past into the present. We are "spiraling" our way forward into Easter and will never end. And palms will forever be fresh!!

Lent:

In less than four weeks, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 2. I'm hoping to possible add a weekday Mass for the Lenten season and have multiple opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconcillication. Operation Rice Bowl will be a part of our Lent, perhaps more visible than the past two years. I'm trying to think of creative ways to incorporate Operation Rice Bowl in our parish life. Mark is working on potentially offering the Ignation Retreat, again, which will be online.


