From Fr. Frank- God Bless You Kate!!

As I announced at the Masses this past weekend, our Director of Religious Education and Lifelong Formation will be leaving St. Teresa's to care for her health. She has been an invaluable part of our parish for 12 years, organizing and directing our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program for our children and families. She has been a prayerful presence, helping and guiding people on their spiritual journeys.

During the pandemic, Kate kept our religious programs strong and very creative, using technology to keep the connections going. This was not an easy task, to say the least. But she did it with conviction and determination. The religious formation of our children did not suffer in the least.

Kate has guided the RCIA program of Initiation, all the Sacramental programs of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation and formed a number of prayer support groups. The past couple of years she has worked in strengthening our Alpha ministry of evangelization, an extension of the Renee My Church process.

I am truly grateful for the gifts Kate has brought to our parish, and her legacy will continue in the memories forged by countless children and adults touched by her ministry. She will be greatly missed. It is sad when someone who has been such a wonderful presence and given so much of herself decides to leave.

But our prayers go out to Kate. Our best response and gift to her will be to continue what she worked so hard to achieve: sharing her deep faith, forming children and adults in the faith and creating ways for people to connect with Christ in ways meaningful to them.

From Fr. Frank- May Fest:

I would like to let all parishioners know about a neighborhood festival that has been planned for the weekend of May 20-22, Friday through late Sunday/Monday morning. During this entire weekend, Armitage Avenue will be closed from Sheffield to Racine, which definately impacts St. Teresa's. Our Confirmation has been scheduled for May 22 at Noon. Given the logistical problems of parking and the large number of people attending, I have decided to move the Confirmation to St. Josaphat's and they have been so gracious and understanding of our sitiutation. The Mass will be the same time, Noon, but at St. Josaphat's with Bishop Bartosic presiding and I will concelebrate. There is a parking lot in back of the church off of Wayne Street. Our French community has scheduled their Confirmation and First Communion for that Saturday May 21st at 6:30pm and are deciding where that will take place. We will have the normal three Masses at 10:00am, Noon and 6:00pm. Parishioners CAN get into the lot via Seminary but must exit the lot from the alley back onto Seminary, since the entrance/exit on Armitage will be closed. Unfortunately, the archdiocese is asking all parishes for a count of how many people attend the masses on that weekend and the weekend prior. I believe this is to assess the impact of COVID on attendance. PLEASE make every effort to come to mass over the two weekends. Our Loaves and Fishes and Food Pantry will go on as normal.
