

Parish Life

From Fr. Frank:

This is the time of the "October count:" at each weekend throughout October, we will count the number of people who attend our Masses. This does not include the people who live stream but only those who physcially come to Mass. We are down about 30-40 percent from our pre-COVID days, a substantial drop in attendance and in the collection. As the year progresses, my hope is that attendance and collections will increase for those who are able to come. I'm grateful for the live streaming which gives those who are traveling, sick or caring for a loved one a way to remain connected. But it is important that we increase the numbers of those who are able to come to Mass. For several months, the Parish Council has been working on a statement of our Mission that best describes our parish. Next week I will include this Mission Statement, that will permanently be posted in our bulletin and on the website. We are also re-formulating the Parish Council, which will be made up of five to six parishioners from differnt ages, gender, cultures, way of loving, single and married. The purpose of the Council will be to focus on the Mission and discern three short term goals (1 year) and two long term goals (2-3 years). They will meet 6-8 times throughout the year to make certain the goals are gradually being implemented and are being communicated in appropriate and creative ways to our parish and beyond. More on this next week and I unviel plans to create a Council and, eventually, a team of parish leaders who will help me make decisions in ways that engage parishioners. I want my pastoring to be rooted in Servant Leadership: listening, dialogue, prayers, discernment, decision. Every pastor has to make decisions, but the manner in which they are made will determine the outcome.
