From Fr. Frank:

Greetings to all as the brisk, cool weather descends upon us as autumn sets in. The colors of the leaves seem a bit more vibrant this year and they are beautiful to behold. But like Spring, this wonderful Season of colors, pumpkins and goblins is so short. We are in transition....

This past week I participated in a gathering of priests from around the archdiocese. It was a good, but sobering, gathering as we talked about the completion of the Renew My Church process that began 7 years ago. As you remember, St. Teresa's was in the first grouping of parishes. The purpose of Renew My Church was twofold: to address the need to merge/close certain parishes due to changes in demographics, the drastic reduction in the number of Catholics participating in Mass and other Sacraments, and to address the continual decline in the number of priests.

Here are some of the numbers. We started the process with approximately 350 parishes. We now have approximately 220. Close to 60 parishes were completely closed, the others merged with neighboring parishes, while maintaining the worship site/church building. Consequently, two or three parishes merged and became one parish, usually with a new Saint name, but the church building remain active; one pastor and pastoral staff with two, possibly three, places where Mass is celebrated. What a challenge they have, but many are rising to the occasion by transforming how parish life and community are experienced.

Mass attendance has significantly dropped even before COVID. But since COVID, parishes are averaging 30 to 40 percent reduction in Mass attendance, meaning physical being present, not counting those live streaming. At St Teresa, before COVID, we were up to nearly 650 people coming to mass, now we barely reach 400. The one consolation: all parishes are experiencing this reduction and live streaming is reaching countless numbers of people who can't come to Mass due to caring for an elderly parent, a child, sickness or traveling. Live streaming is here to stay and we have to creatively respond to this huge shift in how we experience religious practice and devotion. St. Teresa's has many households who watch and tey are from all over the city and country!!

As I mentioned a few weeks ago, I am trying to form a new Parish Council to begin to see new ways of reaching out to those who are searching for a religious home and to reach out to those active parishioners who need continued spiritual formation. I had one parishioner respond. Please consider being a part of this new Council that will meet approximately 6 times throughout the year. The Council will be responsible for coming up with long term and short term goals to strenghthen the Mission of the Parish. And making certain that these goals are being attained, allowing for new goals for which we can strive. Stagnation is not an option, if we want to remain vibrant and open. Please, please consider being on this council. You can let me know by emailing me.
