From Fr. Frank:

This weekend is a time for telling stories and watching movies that make one tremble a bit, shudder with eyes closed in fear, not wanting to face darkness and unknown regions in the imagination. Despite the warm weather, it's a trick of sorts, to lure us into thinking maybe the sun won't go away... maybe the growing darkness is just an illusion. For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, this time of the year evokes and unearths the memory that unites us with those who lived millions of years ago.

Yes, the spirits of all our ancient and not so ancient relatives, come forth, rise, to meet us here and now. Perhaps these "ghosts" wish to frighten us or get back at us for lying to them or betraying their trust. And so we hide behind masks. Just maybe they won't recognize us... if we are lucky!!!

Yes, we are all connected and interwoven within our common humanity, a humanity thta really is just one race with many expressions. In each expression and culture is the desire not to be recognized by angry fore-bearers. We all want to hide from the darkness within and without. We all want the sun to never set or for the cold winter to descend upon us. We flee...

We flee the frightful reality of Death, and lurking deep within is the naive thinking that we can escape aging and death. We can't. It's quite simple. The stranger is hungering and thirsting- Christ is presenting himself to us in their need. We are called to respond with faith and love. Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political oppression and overwhelming poverty in Central and South American countries. These brothers and sisters in need have reveled to us the fragility, strength, and sacredness of our shared humanity. Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in Chicago by mid-October, and a coordinated Catholic response is underway. We are providing pastoral care and considering options such as transitional shelter and parish-family sponsorship opportunities.




