Asylum seekers- men, women and children- are arriving in Chicago. Will you welcome the stranger? We are the body of Christ alive in this world. The stranger is hungering and thirsting- Christ is presenting himself to us in their need. We are called to respond with faith and love. Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political oppression and overwhelming poverty in Central and South American countries. These brothers and sisters in need have reveled to us the fragility, strength, and sacredness of our shared humanity. Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in Chicago by mid-October, and a coordinated Catholic response is underway. We are providing pastoral care and considering options such as transitional shelter and parish-family sponsorship opportunities.


