From Fr. Frank:

Creating Beauty: Our Bell Tower

Faith speak through beauty, literally! A work of art, a painting, a piece of music, novels, stories, preaching, teaching, baking, cooking, writing.... These are all expressions of beauty that nurture and deepen faith.

A Vincentian Brother has been working with students from DePaul trying to create beauty in the form of murals painting on the thick, concrete columns supporting the EL tracks at the Fullerton Ave station. The murals were designed to reflect the various influences and movements associated with Chicago and DePaul. They spent years on this project. Viewing it speaks faith.

You can allow your faith to be expressed in countless ways, but beauty, bringing beauty into the world, is one of the surest ways. And beauty comes in an unlimited number of ways. EVERY human being can be an "artist" if we only see ourselves as co-creators with God in building the Kingdom.

We are bearers of beauty when we see in our actions, our families, our work...ways of expressing our love of God.

Our parish has the opportunity of creating beauty through carefully prepared meals for the hungry, creating initiatives to care for God's Creation, every Liturgy we celebrate is an act and celebration of beauty.

One dream I have had since I became pastor is to make our church building, particularly the Bell Tower, speak beauty. Most people walking by will naturally see the outer walls and the spaces surrounding the church building. Several years ago, while we were renovating the church, I spoke with that Brother about creating a mural of beauty on the large grey wall of the Bell Tower that faces Kenmore Ave. I shelved the idea and focused on the interior of the church.

Perhaps now is the time to revisit the possibility of creating a mural of beauty on that wall, so that when you see it, it won't be just a huge grey wall. That wall can speak our faith. It can speak our mission. It can speak of the glory of God's Creation. Just a thought to plane a small seed of beauty.



SEASON OF ADVENT

1. When does advent begin and end?

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. The first Sunday of Advent is the start of each new Church year.

2. What is it for?

The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word adventus, which means 'coming' or 'visit'.

During this time we connect with the longing and expectant waiting of the Jewish people as they prepared for the advent of the Messiah. We also look forward with similar longing and expectancy to the second advent of Christ that we have been promised.

The Catechism points out both meanings

"When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Saviour's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming."

3. Has it always been celebrated by Catholics?

The Advent tradition has evolved in the life of the Church. There was an early form in Europe, as a period of preparation for the Feast of the Epiphany when converts were traditionally baptised. Like Lent, it had an emphasis on prayer and fasting. A similar practice spread to England.

In Rome, the Advent preparation seems to have appeared in the sixth century, judging from homilies by Pope St Gregory the Great. Over time it became more closely linked to Christmas. At one stage there were five Advent Sundays until Pope Gregory VII (pope from 1073-1088) reduced the number to four.

4. What are the colours of advent?

Advent colours are purple and rose. At Mass the priest's vestments, altar cloths, and Advent candles are purple, except for the third Sunday of the season, Gaudete Sunday, when the colour is rose, for joy. There is also a white candle for Christmas Day itself, usually in the middle of the Advent wreath.




