## SEASON OF ADVENT

The first advent candle ("The Prophet's Candle") is purple and represents hope. The second advent candle ("The Bethlehem Candle") is also purple and represents peace. In some traditions, the second candle and the fourth one ("The Angel's Candle," representing love) may be interchanged.

Each advent candle has some special meaning behind it and presents an opportunity to think about the Christmas season in a new way. The Second Week of Advent is the week of Peace. This verse tells us that Jesus came to be the Prince of Peace. The word peace is the Hebrew word shalom which means completeness or well being. Jesus did not come just to end wars, but to make us complete by saving us from our sinfulness.

#### A Prayer for Faith on the Second Sunday of Advent

Lord Jesus, we are all tempted to live without peace. It is not easy for us to remember that our peace is ultimately found in our status as believers, like your children. Help us to see the times when we have lived without peace and forgive us for our transgression. Set our minds on you, that we may remember you are the prince of peace, and our security comes from you alone. Teach us that this peace is inward, everlasting, and can exist regardless of our circumstances. In whatever way you believe is best, teach us how to live in that peace every day. We ask for that in your holy name, Amen.
