From Fr. Frank:

No one wants to be controlled, whether it be by a spouse, close friend or family member. The source of so many problems in marriages, families, and even in our day to day relationships with co-workers and neighbors is the need to control how one thinks, acts or believes.

A church or religion can easily exhibit behavior of control when it tries to compel the faithful to obey certain dictates or teachings by threatening sin or excommunication. Those in power seem to be prone to want to control. The religious leaders who surrounded Jesus were threatened by his teaching that all are loved by God and the foreigner is frequently the one who is closer to salvation than those very leaders who think they have all the answers.

In today's gospel, those in power despised Jesus saying to a man who was unable to walk, lying before him on a stretcher, "Your sins are forgiven." Jesus was responding to the faith of those who were so determined to bring this disabled man to him, that they cut a hole in the roof of the house in which he was teaching and lowered the man on the stretcher so that Jesus might heal him.

But he doesn't heal the physical disability first, he forgives the man his sins, far more significant. Jesus was restoring the man's inner dignity which had nothing to do with whether he could walk or not.

If he can cause the man to be healed of his physical disability, why couldn't he be able to forgive his sins? And so Jesus does just that, commanding the man to "rise" from his stretcher. The power that emanated from Jesus could not be controlled.

Jesus couldn't be controlled, to the consternation of those in authority. No one can control God's mercy and forgiveness. Even the church...



SEASON OF ADVENT

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice." We light the rose-colored candle on our Advent wreath along with the first two.

It is the Shepherds' candle, reminding that God sent the angels to proclaim His arrival to common man and that He still uses ordinary people today to spread the good news of Christ.


The theme of readings and teachings during Advent is often to prepare for the Second Coming while commemorating the First Coming of Christ at Christmas.

Third Sunday of Advent, Guadete Sunday,

Station with San Pietro in Vaticano (St. Peter's in the Vatican):

The Station is at St. Peter's in the Vatican. After the two great basilicas chosen for the first and for the second Sunday in Advent, we come to St. Peter's in the Vatican, a church which shares with the Lateran the chief feasts of the year. It was selected as the station for today, because on this Sunday occurred the final scrutiny or examination of those candidates preparing for the Ordinations usually held on Ember Saturday in December.

O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.


